provided, however, that the Series 1995 Bonds maturing on and after June 1, 2006 (the "Optional Series 1995 Bonds"), are redeemable at the option of the County prior to maturity in any order of maturity and by lot within a single maturity on June 1, 2005, and on any interest payment date thereafter upon terms of par and accrued interest; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provision of Section 331.402(3), 331.443 and 384.24A of the Code of Iowa, notice duly published and a hearing held thereon, the County has heretofore determined to contract indebtedness and enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") in a principal amount not to exceed \$2,650,000 for the purpose of refunding the Series 1995 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed advisable and necessary that the County enter into an agreement (the "Escrow Agreement") with Bankers Trust Company, Des Moines, Iowa (the "Escrow Agent") for the purpose of providing for the refunding of the Optional Series 1995 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Escrow Agreement, a portion of the loan proceeds (the "Loan Proceeds", in addition to other legally available funds of the County, will be deposited and set aside into an escrow account (the "Escrow Account") with the Escrow Agent, a portion of which funds will be used concurrently with the issuance and delivery of the Notes to purchase direct obligations of the United States of America (the "Government Obligations"), as provided in the Escrow Agreement, which Government Obligations and the interest thereon, together with the remaining cash on deposit in the Escrow Account, will be sufficient to pay and will be pledged solely and only for the payment of the interest on and principal of the Series 1995 Bonds as the same become due and for the prepayment of the principal of the Optional Series 1995 Bonds on June 1, 2005;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The County hereby determines to enter into a loan agreement with Piper Jaffray, Inc., Des Moines, Iowa, as lender (the "Lender"), in substantially the form as has been placed on file with the County, providing for a loan to the County in the principal amount of \$2,450,000, and at a discount of \$6,106.95, for the purpose set forth in the preamble hereof.

The Chairperson of the Board and the County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to sign the Loan Agreement on behalf of the County, and the Loan Agreement is hereby approved.

Section 2. General Obligation County Refunding Notes, in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,450,000, are hereby authorized to be issued in evidence of the obligation of the County under the Loan Agreement, in the denomination of \$5,000 each, or any integral multiple thereof, dated April 1, 1996, maturing on June 1 in each of the years in the principal amounts and bearing interest at the respective rates as follows:

The County reserves the right to prepay part or all of the Notes maturing in each of the years 2006 to 2008, inclusive, prior to and in any order of maturity on June 1, 2005, or on any interest payment date thereafter upon terms of par and accrued interest. If less than all of the Notes of any like maturity are to be redeemed, the particular part of those Notes to be redeemed shall be selected by the Registrar by lot. The Notes may be called in or more units of \$5,000. If less than the entire principal amount of any Note in a denomination of more than \$5,000 is to be redeemed, the Registrar will issue and deliver to the registered owner thereof, upon surrender of such original Note, a new Note or Notes, in any authorized denomination, in a total aggregate principal amount equal to the unredeemed balance of the original Note. Notice of such redemption as aforesaid identifying the Note or Notes (or portion thereof) to be redeemed shall be mailed by certified mail to the registered owners thereof at the addresses shown on the County's registration books not less than 30 nor more than 60 days prior to such redemption date. All of such Notes as to which the County reserves and exercises the right of redemption and as to which notice as aforesaid shall have been given and for the redemption of which funds are duly provided, shall cease to bear interest on the redemption date.

All of the interest on the Notes shall be payable December 1, 1996, and semiannually thereafter on the first day of June and December in each year. Payment of interest on the Notes shall be made to the registered owners appearing on the registration books of the County at the close of business on the fifteenth day of the month next preceding the interest payment date and shall be paid by check or draft mailed to the registered owners at the addresses shown on such registration books. Principal of the Notes shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America to the registered owners or their legal representatives upon presentation and surrender of the Note or Notes at the office of the Paying Agent.

The Notes shall be executed on behalf of the County with the official manual or facsimile signature of the Chairperson of the Board and attested by the official manual or facsimile signature of the County Auditor and shall have the County's seal impressed or printed thereon, and shall be fully registered Notes without interest coupons. In case any officer whose signature or the facsimile of whose signature appears on the Notes shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of the Notes, such signature or such facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such officer had remained in office until delivery.

The Notes shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose until the Certificate of Authentication thereon shall have been signed by the Registrar.

The Notes shall be fully registered as to principal and interest in the names of the owners on the registration books of the County kept by the Registrar, and after such registration, payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon shall be made only to the registered owners or their legal representatives or assigns. Each Note shall be transferable without cost to the registered owner thereof only upon the registration books of the County upon presentation to the Registrar, together with either a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Registrar or the assignment form thereon completed and duly executed by the registered owner or the duly authorized attorney for such registered owner.

The record and identity of the owners of the Notes shall be kept confidential as provided by Section 22.7 of the Code of Iowa.

Notwithstanding anything above to the contrary, the Notes shall be issued initially as Depository Bonds, with one fully registered Note for each maturity date, in principal amounts equal to the amount of principal maturing on each such date, and registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"). On original issue, the Notes shall be deposited with DTC for the purpose of maintaining a book-entry system for recording the ownership interests of its participants and the transfer of those interests among its participants (the "Participants"). In the event that DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the Notes or the County determines not to continue the book-entry system for recording ownership interests in the Notes with DTC, the County will discontinue the book-entry system with DTC. In the event that the County identifies a qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the County will register and deliver replacement Notes, fully registered in the name of such depository, or its nominee, in the denominations as set forth above, as reduced from time to time prior to maturity in connection with redemptions or retirements by call or payment, and in such event, such depository will then maintain the book-entry system for recording ownership interests in the Notes.

Ownership interest in the Notes may be purchased by or through Participants. Such Participants and the persons for whom they acquire interest in the Notes as nominee will not receive certificated Notes, but each such Participant will receive a credit balance in the records of DTC in the amount of such Participant's interest in the Notes, which will be confirmed in accordance with DTC's standard procedures. Each such person for which a Participant has an interest in the Notes, as nominee, may desire to make arrangements with such Participant to have all notices of redemption or other communications of the County to DTC, which may affect such person, forwarded in writing by such Participant and to have notification made of all interest payments.

The County will have no responsibility or obligation to such Participants or the persons for whom they act as nominees with respect to payment to or providing of notice for such Participants or the persons for which they act as nominees.

As used herein, the term "Beneficial Owners" shall hereinafter be deemed to include the person for whom the Participant acquires an interest in the Notes.

DTC will receive payments from the County, to be remitted by DTC to the Participants for subsequent disbursement to the Beneficial Owners. The ownership interest of each Beneficial Owner in the Notes will be recorded on the records of the Participants whose ownership interest will be recorded on a computerized book-entry system kept by DTC.

When reference is made to any action which is required or permitted to be taken by the Beneficial Owners, such reference shall only relate to those permitted to act (by statute, regulation or otherwise) on behalf of such Beneficial Owners for such purposes when notices are given they shall be sent by the County to DTC. DTC shall forward (or cause to be forwarded) the notices to the Participants so that the Participants can forward the same to the Beneficial Owners.

Beneficial Owners will receive written confirmations of their purchases from the Participants acting on behalf of the Beneficial Owners detailing the terms of the Notes acquired. The Rule governs the obligations of certain underwriters to require that issuers of municipal bonds enter into agreements for the benefit of bondholders to provide continuing disclosure with respect to their bonds. To provide for the public availability of certain information relating to the Notes and the security therefor and to permit underwriters of the Notes to comply with the Rule, which will enhance the marketability of the Notes, the Chairperson, of the Board of Supervisors and the County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to execute an Undertaking Concerning Continuing Disclosure (the "Undertaking"), covenanting and agreeing to provide certain specified information, if customarily prepared and publicly available, and notice of the occurrence of certain events, if material; and the Undertaking, when and as executed, is hereby approved. AMBAC Indemnity shall mean AMBAC Indemnity Corporation, a Wisconsin-domiciled stock insurance company.

<u>Municipal Bond Insurance Policy</u> shall mean the municipal bond insurance policy issued by AMBAC Indemnity insuring the payment when due of the principal of and interest on the Notes as provided therein.

- 9.05. <u>Notice to AMBAC Indemnity.</u> While the Municipal Bond Insurance Policy is in effect, the Issuer shall furnish to AMBAC Indemnity:
- (a) as soon as practicable after the filing thereof, a copy of any financial statement of the Issuer and a copy of any audit and annual report of the Issuer;
- (b) a copy of any notice to be given to the registered owners of the Notes, including, without limitation, notice of any redemption of or defeasance of Notes, and any certificate rendered pursuant to this Resolution relating to the security for the Notes; and
 - (c) such additional information as AMBAC Indemnity may reasonably request.

The Issuer shall notify AMBAC Indemnity of any failure of the Issuer to provide relevant notices, certificates, etc. The Issuer will permit AMBAC Indemnity to discuss the affairs, finances and accounts of the Issuer or any information AMBAC Indemnity may reasonably request regarding the security for the Notes with appropriate officers of the Issuer. The Issuer will permit AMBAC Indemnity to have access to and to make copies of all books and records relating to the Notes at any reasonable time. AMBAC Indemnity shall have the right to direct an accounting at the Issuer's expense, and the Issuer's failure to comply with such direction within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of the direction from AMBAC Indemnity shall be deemed a default hereunder; provided, however, that if compliance cannot occur within such period, then such period will be extended so long as compliance is begun within such period and diligently pursued, but only if such extension would not materially adversely affect the interests of any registered owner of the Notes. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution, the Issuer shall immediately notify AMBAC Indemnity if at any time there are insufficient moneys to make any payments of principal and/or interests as required and immediately upon the occurrence of any event of default hereunder.

9.06. Permitted Investments.

- (a) AMBAC Indemnity will allow the following obligations to be used as Permitted Investments for all purposes, including (i) as defeasance investments in refunding escrow accounts and (ii) for the purpose of investing (and receiving premium credit for) accrued and capitalized interest, if any:
 - (1) Cash (insured at all times by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or otherwise collateralized with obligations described in paragraph (2) below), or
 - (2) Direct obligations of (including obligations issued or held in book entry form on the books of) the Department of the Treasury of the United States of America.
- (b) AMBAC Indemnity will allow the following obligations to be used as Permitted Investments for all purposes other than: (I) defeasance investments in refunding escrow accounts and (ii) investing (and receiving credit for) accrued and capitalized interest, if any:
 - (1) obligations of any of the following federal agencies which obligations represent full faith and credit of the United States of America, including:

- Export Import Bank
- Farmers Home Administration
- General Services Administration
- U.S. Maritime Administration
- Small Business Administration
- Government National Mortgage Association (GNMA)
- U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (PHA's)
- Federal Housing Administration;
- (2) bonds, notes or other evidences of indebtedness rated "AAA" by Standard & Poor's Corporation and "Aaa" by Moody's Investors Service, Inc. issued by the Federal National Mortgage Association or the Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation with remaining maturities not exceeding three years;
- (3) U.S. dollar denominated deposit accounts, federal funds and banker's acceptances with domestic commercial banks which have a rating on their short term certificates of deposit on the date of purchase of "A-1" or A-1+" by Standard & Poor's and "P-1" by Moody's Investors Service, Inc. and maturing no more than 360 days after the date of purchase. (Ratings on holding companies are not considered as the rating of the bank);
- (4) commercial paper which is rated at the time of purchase in the single highest classification, "A-1+" by Standard & Poor's and "P-1" by Moody's Investors Service, Inc. and which matures not more than 270 days after the date of purchase;
- (5) investments in a money market fund rated "AAAm" or "AAAm-G" or better by Standard & Poor's Corporation;
- (6) Pre-refunded Municipal Obligations defined as follows: Any bonds or other obligations of any state of the United States of America or of any agency, instrumentality or local government unit of any such state which are not callable at the option of the obligor prior to maturity or as to which irrevocable instructions have been given by the obligor to call on the date specified in the notice; and (A) which are rated, based on the escrow, in the highest rating category of Standard & Poor's Corporation and Moody's Investors Service, Inc. or any successors thereto; or (B) (i) which are fully secured as to principal and interest and redemption premium, if any, by a fund consisting only of cash or obligations described in paragraph (1) above, which fund may be applied only to the payment of such principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on such bonds or other obligations on the maturity date or dates thereof or the specified redemption date or dates pursuant to such irrevocable instructions, as appropriate, and (ii) which fund is sufficient, as verified by a nationally recognized independent certified public accountant, to pay principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds or other obligations described in this paragraph on the maturity date or dates thereof or on the redemption date or dates specified in the irrevocable instructions referred to above, as appropriate;
- (7) investment agreements approved in writing by AMBAC Indemnity with notice to Standard & Poor's Corporation; and
- (8) other forms of investments approved in writing by AMBAC Indemnity with notice to Standard & Poor's Corporation.

- (c) The value of the above investments shall be determined as follows:

- (c) as to certificates of deposit and bankers acceptances: the face amount thereof, plus accrued interest; and
- (d) as to any investment not specified above: the value thereof established by prior agreement between the Issuer and AMBAC Indemnity Corporation.

9.07. Miscellaneous Provisions.

- (a) Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, in the event that the principal and/or interest due on the Notes shall be paid by AMBAC Indemnity pursuant to the Municipal Bond Insurance Policy, the Notes shall remain Outstanding for all purposes, not be defeased or otherwise satisfied and not be considered paid by the Issuer, and all covenants, agreements and other obligations of the Issuer to the registered owners shall continue to exist and shall run to the benefit of AMBAC Indemnity, and AMBAC Indemnity shall be subrogated to the rights of such registered owners.
- (b) As long as the Municipal Bond Insurance Policy shall be in full force and effect, the Issuer and any Registrar agree to comply with the following provisions:
 - (1) At least one (1) day prior to all Interest Payment Dates the Registrar will determine whether there will be sufficient funds to pay the principal of or interest on the Notes on such Interest Payment Date. The Board compared Iowa Communities Assurance Pool's and Northwestern National's proposals of equal coverage. They also reviewed for limits of insurance per loss and the lower workman's compensation experience modification related to loss control/safety program.

Joan Siglin, Area XII Alcohol and Drug Treatment Acting Program Director, explained the effects of the federal/state financial cuts beginning July 1, 1996 totaling \$100,000.00. She informed the Board that referrals from Audubon County are low, therefore, and the counselor from Guthrie County will be providing services to Audubon County residents. He explained the broader coverage, future discounts and vested pool funds to participating members that Iowa Communities Assurance Pool offers. Motion-D.
