"Shall the Board of Directors of the Exira Community School District in the Counties of Audubon, Cass and Guthrie, State of Iowa, be authorized for a period of ten (10) years, to levy annually, as determined by the Board, a voter-approved physical plant and equipment property tax not to exceed One Dollar and Thirty-four Cents (\$1.34) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) of the assessed valuation of the taxable property within the School District, commencing with the levy for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, to be used for the purchase and improvement of grounds; the construction of schoolhouses or buildings and opening roads to schoolhouses or buildings; the purchase of buildings and the purchase of equipment; the payment of debts contracted for the erection or construction of schoolhouses or buildings, not including interest on bonds; procuring or acquisition of libraries; repairing, remodeling, reconstruction, improving, or expanding the schoolhouses or buildings and additions to existing schoolhouses; expenditures for energy conservation; the rental of facilities under Chapter 28E; purchase of transportation equipment for transporting students; lease purchase option agreements for school buildings; or equipment purchases for recreational purposes; it being understood that if this proposition should fail to be approved by the voters, such failure shall not be construed to terminate or restrict authority previously granted by the voters to levy a special tax for any one or more of the foregoing purposes?"

and

WHEREAS, legal, sufficient and timely notice of the submission of the proposition at the election and of the date and hours of the election, and of the voting precinct or precincts thereof, with their corresponding polling place or places, was duly published and a correct and complete copy of the said proposition was posted at each polling place or places during the day of election throughout the hours thereof, all in strict compliance with the orders of the Board of Supervisors:

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF AUDUBON, IN THE STATE OF IOWA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That is hereby found, determined and declared:

First - That said election was held and conducted in each of the voting precincts or precinct of said School District at the respective polling place or places, pursuant to due notice, and in strict compliance with law, and that said proposition and the vote thereon complies strictly with law.

Second - That at said election, on the proposition above set out, there were cast 400 ballots, of which 219 votes were cast "YES" and 181 votes were cast "NO" and 0 ballots were cast blank or defectively

We therefore declare the public measure –(H) "Shall the Board of Directors of the Exira Community School District be authorized for a period of ten (10) years to levy annually, a physical plant and equipment property tax not to exceed One Dollar and Thirty-four Cents (\$1.34) per One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) of the assessed valuation of taxable property, commencing with the levy for collection in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2000, to be used for the purposes set forth in the full ballot; it being understood that if this proposition should fail to be approved by the voters, such failure shall not be construed to terminate or restrict authority previously granted by the voters to levy a special tax for any one or more of the foregoing purposes?" to be adopted.

**WHEREAS**, the County of Audubon (hereinafter referred to as the "County"), State of Iowa, is a political subdivision organized and existing under the law and the Constitution of the State of Iowa (the "State"); and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of Chapter 59 of the Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) is to encourage mutual development objectives between communities and private business and to promote economic investment in enterprise zones within the State; and

WHEREAS, IAC Chapter 59 requires that in order for the County to be eligible to receive benefits under IAC Chapter 59, the County must approve, by resolution, the establishment of an enterprise zone to be certified by the Iowa Department of Economic Board; and

**WHEREAS**, one of the benefits provided under IAC Chapter 59 permits a community to exempt from taxation all or a portion of the actual value added by improvements to real property directly related to new jobs created by the location or expansion of an eligible business under the enterprise zone legislation and used in the operation of eligible business within the zones; and

**WHEREAS,** it is the County's intention to exempt from local taxation from the **first** year the County Assessor assesses the new construction: Tax exemption schedule as follows: (see attached schedule),

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUDUBON COUNTY THE FOLLOWING:

Section 1. The County certifies that it is an eligible participant under HF 724 section 4. 15E.184 distress criteria: as follows: Audubon County meets criteria of A., C. & D. Criteria "A" being that, Audubon County has an average weekly wage that ranks among the bottom twenty-five counties in the state based on the 1995 annual average weekly wage for employees in private business --bottom 10 in the State - \$296.00/week. Criteria "C". being that, according to the U.S. Bureau of the Census -- 1990-1995 Population Loss, Audubon County ranked 2nd in the state for population loss. Criteria "D" being that, according to the U.S. Bureau of the Census, Audubon County ranked 7th in the state with 23.1 percent of our population being 65 years of Age or Older.

Section 2. The County hereby requests enterprise zone certification from the lowa Department of Economic Development Board as authorized in 15E.182 for the following designated sites of 67 acres, which the County certifies is less that 1% of the county area. The legal description being as follows: NW ¼ of the NW ¼ of Section 16, Township 80 North, Range 35 West of the 5<sup>th</sup> P.M. lying east of Highway 71; AND that portion of Lot 1 in the NE ¼ SE ¼ of Section 33, Township 80 North, Range 35 West of the 5<sup>th</sup> P.M. lying west of Highway 71, all in Audubon County, lowa.

Section 3. The County exempts from taxation a portion of the assessed real estate value, in excess of the January 1, 1999 assessment, added by improvements to the property beginning the

year the improvements are first assessed for taxation within the Enterprise Zone and the business enters into an agreement with the County per the following exemption schedule: (See attached schedule)

Section 4. That it is the intention of the County that all eligible businesses in this enterprise zone shall be eligible for all benefits specified in IAC Chapter 59 for an eligible business.

Section 5. That the County shall provide a copy of this resolution to the Iowa Department of Economic Development and shall file this resolution with the County Assessor of Audubon County.

Section 6. That the officers of the County are hereby authorized to take such further actions as are deemed necessary in order to carry into effect the provisions of this resolution.

Section 7. That the provisions of this resolution shall be governed by the laws of the State of Iowa.

Section 9. That the provisions of this resolution are hereby declared to be separable and if any section, phrase, or provision shall for any reason be declared to be invalid, such declaration shall not effect the validity of the remainder of the sections, phrases and provisions hereof.

Section 10. That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

Members of the Conservation Board and the Conservation Director were present to answer questions and make comments concerning the recent Littlefield timber harvest, future plans for the timber area and the upgrade of the road. A Development Plan from the 1960's was viewed and explained which showed a planned road, shelter, latrines, parking and large group camping area within the timber. Various suggestions to the Conservation Board were discussed. Other discussion items included 1.) environmental education, 2.) impact on wildflowers, if any, 3.) the letter of State Forester George Warford and his walk-through with Supervisor Alt and 4.) other areas managed/owned by the Conservation Board. Next the Supervisors, Conservation Board and Director heard comments and answered questions from others at this meeting.

Following the meeting with the Conservation Board, the Board reviewed photos and various information and documentation which had been compiled through their study. A compilation of the written documentation will be retained in the Auditor's Office along with a tape recording of the meeting. The Board further discussed various suggestion items to the Conservation Board.

The Board recessed at 1:39 p.m. to attend a meeting with the Economic Development Board at the Audubon County Economic Development Board meeting room.

The Board reconvened at 1:47 p.m. Others present were Jay Dee Mendenhall, Richard McVinua, George Parris, Ryan Allghen, Lyle Hansen, Jr., Carla Rustvold, Dan Ford, Fran Andersen, Fred Sievers, Marion Burns and Debbie Calber.

A schedule/plan was determined and set up for the different individuals/parties involved to best achieve the goal of possibly having a company locate their business in Audubon County. The Supervisors asked and discussion was held on plans to retain and enhance the integrity of the area involved. The Board and the County Attorney also met with Representatives of MidAmerican Energy Co. regarding incentives that can be offered. No action was taken at this meeting.

The Board recessed at 4:15 p.m. to return to the Courthouse.

The Board reconvened at 4:25 p.m. Fran Andersen was present.

The Board further reviewed information and documentation regarding the Littlefield Timber Harvest.

Motion-Akers Second-Alt to deny the request from Judy Sutcliffe and Juanita Sutcliffe Reynard to remove all Audubon County Conservation Board members and Conservation Director Bruce Haag for their actions in the Littlefield Recreation Area timber harvest. The Board does not find malfeasance or nonfeasance by the Board. The Supervisors have no authority in regard to the Conservation Director but do not find malfeasance or nonfeasance by Bruce Haag. Vote-all in favor.

The Board has thoroughly studied the matter.

Board member Sally Alt accompanied George Warford, State Forester, on a walk through tour of the harvested timber. He observed that the timber was not a virgin timber. He saw evidence of past cuttings and grazing. The State Forester described the cutting as a sheltered woodcutting, from mild to moderate to heavy in different areas. He did not view the harvest as a clear cutting or a group cutting which are more severe. He noted scattered large oaks remaining which are probably over 150 years old. He estimated the remaining dominant and codominant trees to be from 50 to 70 years old and well-stocked with trees of good quality and desirable species. Warford said, "The long term impact of logging in this area will be minimal." He did note that "Whether the harvest was done properly or should have been done at all depends upon the policy, management guidelines, and objectives for this area. These must be determined by the public, Supervisors and Conservation Board.

The other board members individually viewed the timber and viewed photographs taken. The Board has considered the following: public input (individual and three public supervisor meetings), the document submitted by Sutcliffe and Reynard, Conservation Board agendas for the past year, and minutes from its origin in 1963 to the present, two Board of Supervisors meeting minutes prior to the harvest which discussed the impending work, a Board of Supervisor's public notice regarding a \$78,000 budget amendment prior to the harvest on the anticipated revenues and Annual Reports of the Conservation Board. The Board also considered a report from the State Forester, information about the designation of the timber as a "Tree Farm" in 1988 timber management information from the Extension Office, Roy Littlefield Will and probate documents, land transfer documents to Audubon County, Job descriptions for the Conservation Officer and the Conservation Board, media articles, proposed legislation and long-term plans for the Conservation Board.

In 1964 and 1967 an in-depth plan for the Conservation Board showed plans for a one-lane road through the timber, a shelter, rest rooms and camping areas. These plans were not executed. In 1978 the Board received \$23,110.50 from a walnut tree harvest of "marketable walnut trees." Other smaller cuttings were done over the years.

Although different people may have reached other decisions regarding the timber management, the Board finds the Conservation Board reached the resolution they thought appropriate. In viewing the history of the timber, the Board concludes it was not a virgin timber and that Audubon County paid fair market value to Iowa State University for the land which was not restricted in its use.

Suggestions in hindsight may be made. The Board suggests that the Conservation Board consider the following:

- 1. Community Calendar in local papers -- include meeting dates.
- 2. Adopt by-laws
- 3. Note on Agendas where copies of Minutes and other documents may be obtained and hours.
- 4. Keep a copy of the minutes in Courthouse for accessibility.
- 5. Budget to buy Conservation Director a telephone answering machine.
- 6. Budget to buy Conservation Director a copier.
- 7. Send copy of Agenda to local newspapers -- include Elk Horn-Kimballton Review.
- 8. Send copy of agenda to local radio stations.
- 9. Itemize agenda further.
- 10. Checks to the Conservation Board and other entity to be in both names.
- 11. Update the long-range plan for Littlefield Recreation Area and Timber.
- 12. Update the long-range plans for areas under Conservation Board management.

- 13. Annually review list of lands under Conservation Board management in inventory.
- 14. Annually review Inventory of Conservation Board -- property/equipment and date acquired.

  - A. **CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE**: As used in this Chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, controlled substance shall mean any drug, substance or immediate precursor enumerated, defined or established pursuant to the provisions of Schedules I, II, III, IV and V of Division II of **lowa Code Chapter** 124 (1999), as amended, known as the Controlled Substances Act.
  - B. **DRUG PARAPHERNALIA**: As used in this Chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, drug paraphernalia shall mean all equipment, products, and materials of any kind which are used, intended for use, or designed for use, in manufacturing, injecting,

ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance, as defined by **lowa Code Chapter** 124 (1999) as amended. It shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 1. Growing Kits: Kits used or intended for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing or harvesting of any species of plant which is a controlled substance or from which a controlled substance can be derived;
- 2. Processing Kits. Kits used or intended for use in manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing or preparing controlled substances;
- 3. Isomerization Devices. Isomerization devices used or intended for use in increasing the potency of any species of plant which is a controlled substance;
- 4. Testing Equipment. Testing equipment used or intended for use in identifying or in analyzing the strength, effectiveness or purity of controlled substances;
- Scales. Scales and balances used or intended for use in weighing or measuring controlled substances;
- 6. Dilutents. Dilutents and adulterants, such as quinine hydrochloride, mannitol, mannite, dextrose and lactose, used, intended for use, or designed for use in cutting controlled substances;
- Separators-Sifters. Separation gins and sifters used, intended for use, or designed for use in removing twigs and seeds from, or otherwise cleaning or refining of marijuana;
- 8. Mixing Devices. Blenders, bowls, containers, spoons and mixing devices used, intended for use, or designed for use in compounding controlled substances;
- 9. Containers. Capsules, balloons, envelopes and other containers used, intended for use, or designed for use in packaging small quantities of controlled substances;
- 10. Storage Containers. Containers and other objects used, intended for use, or designed for use in storing or concealing controlled substances;
- 11. Injecting Devices. Hypodermic syringes, needles, and other objects used, intended for use, and designed for use in parenterally injecting controlled substances into the human body; and
- 12. Ingesting-Inhaling Devices. Objects used, intended for use, or designed for use in ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing a controlled substance into the human body, which shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
  - a. Metal, wooden, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic, or ceramic pipes with or without screens, permanent screens, hashish heads, or punctured metal bowls;
  - b. Water pipes;
  - c. Carburetion tubes and devices;
  - d. Smoking and carburetion masks;

- e. Roach clips, meaning objects used to hold burning material, such as marijuana cigarette, which has become too small or too short to be held in the hand;
- f. Miniature cocaine spoons, and cocaine vials;
- g. Chamber pipes;
- h. Carburetor pipes;
- i. Electric pipes;
- j. Air-driven pipes;
- k. Chillums;
- I. Bongs; and
- m. lce pipes or chillers.
- C. **DETERMINATION OF WHAT CONSTITUTES WHETHER AN OBJECT IS DRUG PARAPHERNALIA**: In determining whether an object is drug paraphernalia, a court or other authority shall consider, in addition to all other logically relevant factors, the following:
- 1. Statement by an owner or by anyone in control of the object concerning its use;
- 2. Prior convictions, if any, of an owner, or of anyone in control of the object, under any State or federal laws in relation to any controlled substance as defined in **lowa Code Chapter** 124 (1999), as amended;
- 3. The proximity of the object, in time and space, to a direct violation of **lowa Code Chapter** 124 (1999), as amended;
- 4. The proximity of the object to a controlled substance as defined in **lowa Code Chapter** 124 (1999), as amended;
- 5. The existence of any residue of a controlled substance as defined in **lowa Code Chapter** 124 (1999), as amended;
- 6. Direct or circumstantial evidence of an owner, or anyone in control of the object, delivering it to any person whom he or she knows, or should reasonably know, may use the object to facilitate a violation of this Chapter. The innocence of an owner, or of anyone in control of an object, as to a direct violation of this Chapter shall not prevent a finding that the object is intended in use, or designed for use as drug paraphernalia;
- 7. Instructions, oral or written, provided with the object concerning its use;
- 8. Descriptive materials accompanying the object which explains or depicts its use;
- 9. National or local advertising concerning its use;
- 10. The manner in which the object is displayed for sale:
- 11. Whether the owner, or anyone in control of the object, is a legitimate supplier of like or related items in the County, such as licensed distributor or dealer of tobacco products;

- 12. Direct or circumstantial evidence of the ratio of sales of the objects to the total sales of the business enterprise;
- 13. The existence and scope of any legitimate use for the object in the County; and
- 14. Expert testimony concerning its use.
- Section II.

  <u>USE OR POSSESSION</u>: It shall be unlawful for any person to use or to possess with intent to use, drug paraphernalia to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store, contain, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale, or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance as defined in **lowa Code Chapter** 124 (1999), as amended. However, it shall not be unlawful to possess drug paraphernalia for the purpose of use as evidence or for use in education.
- DELIVER, POSSESS OR MANUFACTURE: It shall be unlawful for any person to deliver, possess with intent to deliver, or manufacture with intent to deliver, drug paraphernalia knowing, or under circumstances where one reasonably should know, that it will be used to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store, contain, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale, or otherwise be used to introduce into the human body a controlled substance as defined in lowa Code Chapter 124 (1999), as amended. However, it shall not be unlawful to possess or deliver drug paraphernalia for the purpose of use as evidence or for use in education.
- Section IV. PENALTIES: Any person who violates any of the provisions of this Chapter shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days for each violation. The criminal penalty surcharge required by lowa Code Section 911.2 (1999) shall be added to a county fine and is not a part of the county's penalty.
- Section V. REPEALER: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. However, such repeal shall be only to the extent of such conflict.
- Section VI. <u>SEVERABILITY CLAUSE</u>: If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- Section VII. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>: This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

The Audubon County Board of Supervisors met in regular session pursuant to adjournment. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Deist at 9:30 a.m. Supervisors present were LaVerne V. Deist, Sally R. Alt and Harold F. Akers. Others in attendance included Doug Weston, Bill Shaw, Todd Johnson, Darren Dea, Ivan Andersen, Dan Ford and Ted Ely.

Motion-Alt Second-Akers to approve 1.) the agenda with the addendum of Dan Ford to provide an update on the intent to sell a tract of the county farm Audubon County Economic Development (ACED) and 2.) the May 6, 1999 board meeting minutes. Vote-all in favor.

Motion-Akers Second-Alt to accept and place on file the Sheriff's Monthly Report of Fees Collected for April, 1999. Vote-all in favor.

Courthouse Custodian Doug Weston appeared before the Board to review Otis Elevator's maintenance proposal. Doug is to contact Otis Elevator for additional information.

Next, Doug reported on a quote from Taylor Industries for an additional emergency fire exit door/frame with a steel stairway -- which the state fire marshal's office is requiring.

Sheriff Bill Shaw, Chief Deputy Todd Johnson, and Doug then reviewed Taylor Industries proposal for a door/door frame to be placed in the lower hallway near the dispatcher's office -- the area is to be used as a containment area. The containment area is to promote safety/security for the Sheriff's Office and the Courthouse. Bill and Doug will contact Taylor's for additional security information before action is taken.

Bill and Todd then requested creating a new full-time position in the Sheriff's Office due to the change in a part-time position. He made a comparison of expenses for a part-time employee to a full-time employee. They discussed housing prisoners from other counties and fees for the same. Fees for other services were also discussed.

Ivan Andersen, of Audubon, and Assistant Engineer Darren Dea discussed that portion of 215<sup>th</sup> Street lying east of the county supply yard that he has been responsible for. They also discussed future plans for the seal coat road (215th Street) that lies west of the county's supply yard. Ivan asked about asphalting the road in the future. He agreed to pay for future seal coat or asphalt costs that he is currently responsible for.

Darren reported that in order to close the contaminated site at the county shop, a well on Ivan's property, lying east of the county shop -- as recommended by Environment Resources Services, an environmental consulting firm -- would need to be capped. Ivan gave verbal permission that he would have the well capped and plans to contact the sanitarian. The Board agreed to pay for any additional costs over the well closing permit costs.

Ivan asked about having a sign placed on property, which lies along Highway 71. The Board informed him to contact the Dept. of Transportation in Atlantic.

Darren presented two GTE Telephone Co.'s utility permit applications. Motion-Akers Second-Alt to approve the two GTE permit applications for the following locations: 1.) between Sections 14 & 15 of Leroy Township, along Kingbird Ave. and 2.) between Sections 31 & 32 of Viola Township, along Nighthawk Ave – both are replacement lines. Vote-all in favor.

Darren reported on a letter he received from the Dept. of Transportation regarding various bridges that need to be posted for closing or load limits – both county and city bridges. Darren plans to send a letter to the Cities of Brayton and Gray regarding their bridges.

Darren reported the following items: 1.) that he will be sending temporary easements to the property owners near the EWP projects—he also provided an update on the status of the other EWP projects; 2.) that in order to close the contaminated site at the county shop any plastic water line that may run through this property; 3. that Tom Garber is requesting that dirt be hauled into the West Audubon Park Project (the dirt would be hauled to the park on the driver's way back to the county shop)—the Board was in agreement to allow the county driver's to haul the dirt to the park on their way back to the county shop at the end of the day and 4.) gravel specs and hauling of rock.

Audubon County Economic Development Director Dan Ford met with the Board to discuss various items regarding the possible sale of land to ACED. He requested that if the revolving

WHEREAS, the second amendment, which would require a 60% "supermajority" in the General Assembly to enact a tax increase, is a bad idea because it would allow a minority of legislators to control lowa's public policy, rather than allowing majority rule to work, and because it will cause the State of lowa to put more unfunded mandates on counties which will mean increases in property taxes; and

**WHEREAS**, the two amendments are more than 2,000 words long, and are complicated and confusing, so no one really knows for sure what their impact will be;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Audubon County Board of Supervisors goes on record as opposing the passage of these proposed constitutional amendments, and urges voters to oppose these shortsighted and dangerous constitutional amendments as well.

## AMENDED ORDINANCE #99-3 TO AUTHORIZE COUNTY TO LEVY FOR AUDUBON COUNTY AIRPORT

BE IT HEREIN ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa:

99-3-1. <u>Title and Purpose.</u> The purpose of this Ordinance, and amendments hereto, is to authorize the County of Audubon to assess an annual levy on all taxable property in

the unincorporated area of the County for the exclusive and proper use of the Audubon County Airport Authority, all in accordance with and subject to the provision of **lowa Code Chapter** 330A.

- 99-3.2. <u>Assessment of Levy.</u> Having joined the Audubon County Airport Authority and in compliance with **lowa Code Section** 330A.15, Audubon County shall assess an annual levy on all taxable property in the unincorporated area of the County for the exclusive and proper use of the Audubon County Airport Authority. The levy shall be twelve cents per one thousand dollars of assessed value.
- 99-3.3. <u>Duration of Levy.</u> Said levy shall commence during Fiscal Year 1999-2000 and shall continue annually, through Fiscal Year 2030-2031.
- 99-3.4. <u>Collection of Levy.</u> Said levy shall be collected in the manner other taxes are collected and allocated and shall be paid to the Authority.
- 99-3.5. Records. The Authority, pursuant to **lowa Code Section** 330A.15, shall deposit said funds in a special trust fund to be called the Audubon County Airport Authority Capital Reserve Fund and shall keep a record of said deposits.
- 99-3.6. Annual Report and Budget. The Authority shall submit annually, on or before February 1 of each year an annual report of receipts and expenditures and shall submit a budget for the next fiscal year to the County for the Authority. Said report and budget shall be submitted to the Auditor of the County for delivery to the Board of Supervisors.
- 99-3.7. Use of Said Levy. Said levy is for the exclusive and proper use of the Authority, including but not limited to: the purchase of land; the acquisition, establishment, construction, enlargement, operation, and maintenance of aviation facilities in Audubon County; funding studies, plans; and other expenses of the Authority pursuant to **lowa Code Chapter** 330A.
- 99.3.8. <u>Enforcement of Collection.</u> The Authority shall have the power to enforce the collection of such levy by mandamus or other appropriate remedy.
- 99.3.9. <u>Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, as amended, are hereby repealed.
- 99-3.10. Severability Clause. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication will not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- 99-3.11. When Amendment Effective. This amended ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 99-58**

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A RESIDENTIAL ANTI-DISPLACEMENT AND RELOCATION ASSISTANCE PLAN (RARA) under Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended.

WHEREAS: Audubon County, Iowa

henceforth referred to as the local government, will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate-income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate-income housing in connection with an activity assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, in accordance with the requirements described in 24 CFR 570.496(c)(1).

All replacement housing will be provided within three years after the commencement of the demolition or conversion. Before entering into a contract committing the Local Government to provide funds for an activity that will directly result in demolition or conversion, the Local Government will make public by publication in a paper of general circulation and submit to the lowa Department of Economic Development the following information in writing:

- 1. A description of the proposed activity.
- 2. The exact location on a map (including addresses) and the exact number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate-income dwelling units as a result of the essential activity;
- 3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;

- 4. The exact location on a map and exact number of dwelling units that will be provided as replacement dwelling units. If such data are not available at the time of the general submission, the Local Government will identify the general location on an area map and the approximate number of dwelling units by size and provide information identifying the specific location and number of dwelling units by size as soon as it is available:
- 5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of replacement dwelling units:
- 6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain a low/moderateincome dwelling unit for a least ten (10) years from the date of initial occupancy, and:
- 7. Information demonstrating that any proposed replacement of dwelling units with smaller dwelling units is consistent with the housing needs of low/moderate-income households in the jurisdiction.

Audubon County, 318 Leroy, Audubon, Iowa 50025 telephone (712) 563-2584 is responsible for tracking the replacement of housing and ensuring that it is provided within the required period.

Audubon County is responsible for ensuring requirements are met for notification and provision of relocation assistance, as described in CFR 570.496(a)(c)(2), to any low/moderate-income person displaced by the demolition of any dwelling unit or the conversion of a low/moderate-income dwelling unit to another use in connection with an assisted activity.

Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities assisted under the Act, the Local Government will take the following steps to minimize the displacement of persons from their homes:

- Evaluate housing codes and rehabilitation standards in reinvestment areas to prevent 1. their placing undue financial burden on established owners or tenants of multi-family buildings.
- 2. Establish facilities to house persons who must be relocated temporarily during rehabilitation.
- 3. Adopt policies which protest tenants from developers that would rehabilitate housing in such a manner that it would no longer be affordable to low/moderate-income families or individuals.
- Establish counseling centers to provide homeowners and renters with information on the 4. assistance available to help them remain in their neighborhood in the face of revitalization or rehabilitation efforts.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Audubon County will provide relocation assistance as described by 49 CRF 24, Subplots C, D, and E for 24 CRF 570.496a (E)(2), whichever is applicable, to each low/moderate-income dwelling to another use as a direct result of assisted activities.

An agreement between landowners on each side of the highway must be secured before we permit a crossing. The County Engineer's Office shall determine the necessity of crossing the road for a suitable outlet by letter from the NCRS stating such. On gravel or earth roads the tiler may continue thru the road. Backfill/surfacing will be as directed by the Engineer. The landowners will be subject to costs associated with settlement, blading and surfacing the crossing at a later date as deemed appropriate. Boring will be required under paved roads.

All request for tile crossings should be submitted two weeks before construction. The contractor's estimated cost will be reviewed before the permit can be granted. Audubon County will participate in a costs share arrangement for the tile crossings up to the following amounts:

Dirt Road \$350.00 Gravel and/or Seal Coat \$500.00 Paved Road \$750.00

Any work started before receiving written permission will not be considered for payment.

All necessary and proper barricades, flares, etc., as per the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, shall be furnished by and maintained by the applicant. Maximum safety precautions shall be maintained at all times to protect workers, property owners and the traveling public from accidents due to the operations of the applicant.

Audubon County shall be indemnified and saved harmless of any damages resulting from the applicant's operations.

Cost share payment will be made to the applicant, owner or operator upon receipt of a signed claim form and the applicant's bill (or copy) from the contractor.

Motion-Alt Second-Akers to accept and place on file the Greeley Township Clerk's Annual Statement of Receipts and Disbursements of Township Funds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1999. Vote-all in favor.

#### **AMENDED ORDINANCE 99-4**

## CHAPTER 100: AUDUBON COUNTY SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL ORDINANCE

Be it hereby enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, lowa:

100.1 <u>Title and Purpose</u>. This Chapter shall be known as the "Audubon County Snow and Ice Removal Ordinance".

The purpose of this ordinance is to establish Audubon County's policy regarding level of service in respect to clearance of snow or ice and maintenance of its secondary road system during the winter months, specifically defined as October through April, as provided in Section 668.10(2) (1999), Code of Iowa, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 309.67, Code of Iowa. This policy and level of service is to be implemented within the amount of money budgeted for this service, and as contained in this County's secondary road budget as submitted to and approved by the Iowa Department of Transportation and adopted by Board of Supervisors.

100.2 Level of Services. Clearance of snow or ice and maintenance of the secondary road system during the winter months is primarily for the benefit of the local residents of this county. Each storm has individual characteristics and must be dealt with accordingly. The portion of the roadway improved for travel will have upon it snow and ice in compacted condition. These conditions may be continuous, or they may be more concentrated on hills, in valleys, curves, and/or intersections. Audubon County's existing snow removal equipment will be utilized for this purpose. On occasion County personnel may be rendered unavailable due to the requirements of the Omnibus Transportation Employee Testing Act of 1991. Except for "emergencies" as determined by the County Engineer's professional judgement, or his/her designee acting in his/her absence, on a case by case basis, all clearance of snow and ice,

sanding, salting, and other maintenance respecting winter conditions shall be accomplished within the amount of money budgeted for this service and as practicable. The entire width of that portion of the road improved for travel may not be cleared of snow, ice, compacted snow and ice or frost. Snow cleared from that part of the roadway improved for travel shall be placed on or in the adjacent shoulder, ditch, or right-of-way. Snow can be expected to

accumulate adjacent to the traveled portion to the extent that a motorists sight distance to both left and right may be greatly reduced or impaired. The snow removed from intersections will be piled in its corners in piles of unequal height. The line of sight, sight distance, or visibility of motorist approaching these intersections may be greatly reduced or impaired. Audubon County shall not be responsible for snow pushed or otherwise placed on the roadway or shoulder by others.

Motorist shall drive their vehicles during these conditions with additional caution and watchfulness, especially in respect to the surface of the roadway, and reduced or impaired visibility, and are advised to reduce their speed at least 25 miles per hour below that legally permitted or advised under normal conditions. In respect to roadways that have only one lane open, further extreme watchfulness and caution should be exercised by the motorist, and their speed should not exceed 10 miles per hour. During these conditions, no additional warning or regulatory signs will be placed warning of impaired sight distances, visibility at intersections, road blockages, one lane conditions, or that the road surface is slick or slippery, or what the advised speed should be.

100.3 <u>Sequence of Service</u>. In the implementation of snow and ice removal and other maintenance of the Audubon County secondary road system during the winter months, the County Engineer shall select the actual sequence of roads to be cleared as provided for in that section of the ordinance and shall determine when drifting, wind velocity, and additional snow or snow storms require that the snow removal equipment be removed from the roadway or that additional clearance of paved routes be accomplished prior to the clearance of gravel and dirt roads. The County Engineer's professional judgment or his/her designee's, shall prevail unless it is clearly erroneous.

#### A. Paved routes.

- (1) The initial effort will be to get all routes open to two lane traffic as soon as possible and/or practicable. During initial snow removal operations, paved roads may only have one-lane plowed for a period of time.
- (2) After two lane travel is possible, subsequent snow removal will be carried on during normal working hours.
- (3) The truck mounted snow plows and spreaders will not normally be in operation between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. The trucks may be called off the road if snow and/or blowing snow reduces visibility to hazardous working conditions in the professional judgment of the engineer or his/her delegated representative.
- (4) When required, due to drifting snow, motor graders may be used to keep the paved roads open and the opening of gravel roads may be delayed.
- (5) It is not the policy of Audubon County to provide a "dry" pavement condition.
- (6) After roads have been plowed as provided in this section, intersections, hills, and curves may, but not necessarily, have placed on them, salt, sand or other abrasives.

These intersections, hills, and curves may not be resanded, resalted, or have other abrasives replaced on them between snow storms.

## B. Unpaved roads.

- (1) The initial effort will be to get all routes to occupied rural residences open to one lane traffic as soon as possible and/or practicable after a storm has passed.
- (2) After one lane travel is possible, subsequent snow removal will be carried on during normal working hours.
- (3) Motor graders and/or truck plows will not normally be in operation between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. The motorgraders and/or truck plows may be called off the road if snow and blowing reduces visibility to hazardous working conditions, in the professional judgment of the engineer or his/her delegated representative.
- (4) Snow removal will be performed only in "Emergency" situations for roads designated Level B. No snow removal will be done on Level C roads.

#### C. Private drives.

The County will not clear snow from private drives. Normal snow removal operations may result in snow being deposited in private drives. Snow from private drives shall not be placed on the roadway or shoulders.

### D. Mailbox and fence replacement.

The County will assume no liability for mailboxes and fences damaged because of snow removal unless such action can be determined to be malicious. The County will not replace mailboxes or fences damaged or knocked down by the force of snow thrown from the plow.

There is no time limit after a snow storm in which any of the above sequence of clearance on paved or unpaved roads shall take place.

- 100.4 <u>Limitation of Service</u>. Notwithstanding anything else stated in this ordinance, the policy and level of service provided for in this ordinance shall not include the following, and the following services shall not be performed:
- A. Sanding, salting, or placing of other abrasives upon the roadway that are slick, slippery, and dangerous due to the formation of frost.
- B. Sanding, salting, or placing of other abrasives upon paved roadways due to freezing precipitation that occurs outside the county's usual working hours.
- C. Placing of additional warnings or regulatory signs warning of impaired sight distances, visibility at intersections, road blockages, one-lane conditions, or that the road surface is slick or slippery, or what the advised speed should be.
- D. Sanding, salting, or placing abrasives upon any road, except for paved roads. If in the opinion of the County Engineer, or his/her designee, an "emergency" exists and ice has built up

on hills and intersections on the gravel system that slope down to another road so as to become dangerous, abrasive material may be applied at these locations as crew and equipment availability allows and only as a last resort. This condition will not, under any circumstances, take a higher priority than placing of abrasive material on the paved road system and will only be done after the paved roads are cleared of ice and snow. Abrasive material will also only be placed after other mechanical means have been tried and failed, such as scraping with motorgraders.

E. Removing of sand, salt, or other abrasives

## 100.5 Emergency conditions.

- A. The sequence of service may be suspended during "emergency" conditions. An "emergency" condition shall be considered as one where loss of life is probable, where serious injury has occurred, or where extensive loss of property is imminent. These conditions should be verified through the 911 dispatcher or Sheriff's Office. The County may respond to all "emergency" conditions, either during or after a snowstorm. Any person who makes a false report of an "Emergency" to an officer, official, or employee of Audubon County or who causes a false report to be so made shall, upon conviction, be subject to a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment of not more than 30 days in the County jail.
- B. Service or the level or sequence of service shall be further suspended in the event the Governor, by proclamation, implements the State disaster plan, or the Chairperson of the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, by proclamation, implements Audubon County's disaster plan. If such occurs, Audubon County personnel and equipment shall be immediately subject to the direction of the Governor or the Chairperson of the Board of Supervisors.
- 100.6 Repealer. All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
- 100.7 <u>Severability Clause</u>. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- 100.8 <u>When Effective</u>. This ordinance shall be in effect immediately after its final passage, and publication as provided by law.
