Next, Dan reviewed and recommended the proposed revised entrance policy and application forms. Motion-Akers Second-Deist to adopt the Audubon County Entrance Policy as follows: Vote-all in favor.

AUDUBON COUNTY ENTRANCE POLICY

BACKGROUND:

It is intended by the Audubon County Board of Supervisors to provide adequate access off the Secondary Road System to all residents. For agricultural uses, one entrance will be allowed for each 40 acre parcel or more, unless divided by a waterway. Residential and commercial access will be considered on a case by case basis.

POLICY:

Realizing the above conditions and circumstances, and wanting to be as efficient in the use of road funds as possible, the Board of Supervisors has adopted the following policy.

- The County Engineer will require a no cost permit for each new or widened entrance to the Secondary Road System. Location of entrance will be at the owner's request if sight distance (350' min. - gravel, 600' min. - paved) and other related factors are approved by the Engineer.
- 2. Slope from the edge of entrance to the ditch flowline will be as follows:

Paved Road/Dry Fill = 8:1

Paved Road/Culvert = 6:1

Gravel Road/Dry Fill = 4:1

Gravel Road/Culvert = 4:1

The minimum width on private entrances is 20 ft. and maximum on a commercial entrance is 32 ft. Audubon County will designate the minimum length and diameter of pipe to achieve efficient drainage and width of entrance. No entrance pipe shall be less than 18 inches in diameter.

Board of Supervisors Meeting March 6, 2000 (continued)

- 3. The first priority for equipment used in entrance placement is cleaning out the ends of drainage structures, replacing damaged or separated culverts, washouts, and bridges. Therefore, entrance work is a low priority scheduling item. The owner may have the entrance installed by private contractors or with his own equipment. All work by others will be subject to approval by road foreman.
- 4. Costs of all new/permitted installations will be borne by the owner. The County will maintain stockpiles of new pipe for purchase. Audubon County will assume maintenance of entrances after installation.
- 5. All culverts placed in entrances shall be new materials that meet IDOT specifications.
- 6. Extensions of existing entrances will only be allowed when the ends of the existing culvert are suitable to allow same.
- 7. The owner who needs surfacing on said drive will do so at his cost as the County will only do so to house drives when grading, paving, or repairing.
- 8. Approximately midway between the right of way line (fence line) and the edge of the road, the elevation of the entrance shall be at least six (6) inches lower than that of the edge of the road.
- 9. All necessary and proper barricades, flares, etc., as per the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, shall be furnished by and maintained by the applicant. Maximum safety precautions shall be maintained at all times to protect workers, property owners and the traveling public from accidents due to the operations of the applicant.
- 10. Audubon County shall be indemnified and saved harmless of any damages resulting from the applicant's operations.
- 11. This policy voids and takes precedence over any previous policy on entrances in Audubon County.

- A. Prior to time of sale of a parcel of property in Audubon County, all wells on the parcel being offered for sale must be brought into compliance with Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter 49 "Non-public Water Wells" and Chapter 39 "Properly Plugging Abandoned Wells" and all applicable Audubon County Board of Health Regulations. It is the responsibility of the seller, or agent, to complete these requirements PRIOR TO the sale. Failure to do so is considered a simple misdemeanor and may result in a \$100 fine.
- B. An lowa Groundwater Hazard Statement must be submitted to the Health Department prior to the time of sale. Health Department staff shall conduct an inspection to determine whether wells are in use, stand-by or abandoned and whether they are maintained, need repaired or plugged as prescribed by State Code and County regulations. Upgrading, repairs and/or plugging as a part

of the sale is to insure that stand-by and abandoned wells are in compliance with Chapters 49 and 39 and applicable County regulations.

- C. Each well determined to be an in use well shall have a coliform bacteria and nitrate test performed on it by the Department. DNR Form 542-1207, or its equivalent, shall be completed. The results of this test shall be provided to the buyer prior to time of sale and is used for informational purposes only.
- D. Should a Groundwater Hazard Statement be received after the sale has been completed, the new owner shall be responsible for bringing all wells into compliance with these rules.
- E. Cisterns pose a potential safety hazard and shall be inspected the same as wells. They shall therefore either be maintained in a safe manner as determined by the Health Department or the cistern must be properly filled in accordance with the Health Department's procedures.

8-89.6 (2i) shall read as follows: "Other Pre-Existing Water Wells." All other private water wells in existence before the effective date of this ordinance and within the jurisdiction of the Audubon County Board of Health, shall not be required to comply with the requirements of these regulations unless, in the opinion of the Health Department, a public health hazard exists.

All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

The Board of Supervisors and Audubon County Board of Health members along with Sanitarian Steve Patterson held a joint meeting along with citizens from Hamlin at 7 p.m. on November 20, 2000. Supervisors present were LaVerne V. Deist, Harold F. Akers and Sally R. Alt. Board of Health members included Charlotte Fett, Robert Blomme, Dr. T.L. Sprague and Cleone Tessman. Also present were Steve Patterson and Carey Butler of the Guthrie County Sanitarian's Office. Others present PHN Agency Administrator - Peggy Mendenhall, Vernie Venteicher, Jay Dee Mendenhall, Duane Tessman, Brad Christensen, Ron and Donna Nielsen, LaVerne and Kathy Strasser, Marge Christensen, Monte L. and Julie Dreher, Nancy and Ray D. Dreher, Dean and Kristy Letzring, Allen and Diane Petersen, Darrell Munch, Bill Murray, David LaFoy, Frank Howell, Conrad Jones, Secretary - Becky Randeris, Region 12 Council of Government's Rep - Chris Whitaker and Iowa DNR Rep - Dan Stipe. Carey Butler started the Hamlin Town Meeting at 7 p.m. by introducing herself, Sanitarian Steve Patterson, the Board of Supervisors, Chris Whittaker of Region 12 and Dan Stipe of the Iowa DNR.

Dan Stipe then briefly outlined the events that lead up to the discovery of the sewage being discharged into the Bluegrass Creek east of Hamlin. On June 12, 2000 the DNR was contacted concerning a fish kill in the Bluegrass Creek south of Audubon. A DNR investigator walked the creek and found the discharge. Tests confirmed that this discharge was sewage and that it was coming from Hamlin. Since Hamlin is not incorporated the DNR sent a notice to the Audubon County Board of Health informing them they were in violation of Chapter 69 of the Iowa Administrative Code. The DNR has been in contact with and putting pressure on the Board of Health, Region 12 and the Board of Supervisors to have this matter resolved.

Carey Butler explained that the Board of Health, Board of Supervisors and the Guthrie County Sanitarian's Office have already held several meetings on this matter. As a result of these meetings they have adopted a 3-year plan starting January 1, 2001 that will require all the properties in Hamlin to have a permitted septic system within the three year period. The Sanitarian's office has record of five properties permitted in Hamlin and these properties are exempt.

Bringing the old septic systems up to code entails percolation tests, locating wells and measuring the distance between the wells and the lateral field. The Sanitarian will need the landowner's permission to be on their property for this. The cost of the perc test is \$100 plus \$50 for the septic permit. Property owners should contact the Sanitarian's office as soon as possible to be put on the waiting list for a perk test. They only have one staff member who does perc tests for a four county area and only one or two perc tests can be done per day.

Local contractors can be used to put in the new up to code septic systems.

If in some cases the lateral field is too close to a well another source of water will have to be secured. The Board of Supervisors and the Board of Health have been in contact with Regional Rural Water of Avoca, West Central Iowa Rural Water of Manning and the City of Audubon regarding the possibility of providing Hamlin with water. West Central Iowa Rural Water does not plan to expand in this area in the next three years. However, both the City of Audubon and Regional Rural Water of Avoca showed an interest.

Steve Patterson explained that the lowa Legislature passed a law last year setting aside \$3,000,000 to help rural people obtain a loan at approximately 1% interest to put in a septic system. This loan can be spread over a 10-15 year period and is similar to a SBA or FHA Loan where you go to a local bank to borrow the money with the federal government backing the loan. The only catch is the Legislature forgot to officially set up the funding but are supposed to take care of this oversight in their next session. Steve will obtain the number of the bill or the lowa Code number so that the Hamlin citizens can talk to their representative and request their support of this legislation and help with passage as soon as possible. There is also the possibility that Hamlin residents could apply for a loan as a group.

Sanitarian Patterson was questioned whether Hamlin is being targeted as there are several other locations in the county where the septic systems are not up to code and these property owners are not being forced to comply. Steve responded that he doesn't have enough manpower to check every septic system in the four county area so he had to prioritize and set up a system that was fair to everyone. He has seen some of these systems but looked the other way until

something happened or a complaint was received. Hamlin has been overlooked in the past, but now a complaint has been filed and something must be done. Eventually every septic system in the state will be required to be up to code.

Chris Whitaker explained three different funding agencies. The first was a Community Development Block Grant. This grant is based on \$1,000 per capita, has federal funding, requires all the work be done at one time and typically requires hiring an engineer along with some local participation. The county would probably have to pay these costs and then charge the Hamlin property owners a user fee.

The second was a DNR State Revolving Loan Fund. The loan would be made through the county with the Hamlin property owners paying user fees. This is a 20-year loan with a 3.5% to 4% interest rate and all the work must be done at one time.

The third was an USDA Loan Development. The loan would be made through the county with the Hamlin property owners paying user fees. This is a 40-year loan with a 5.5% to 6% interest rate and all the work must be done at one time.

All these loans require a management system because of the federal money and they would want to see maintenance records, etc.

Another possibility is setting up a Sanitary District as per Chapter 358 of the Code of Iowa. Hamlin would have to vote to setup this district and then elect three to five people to serve on a board. This Board of Trustees would have assessing authority and taxation authority (although very small).

Steve Patterson would like two or three individuals from Hamlin and one person each from the Board of Supervisors, Board of Health, Region 12 and Sanitarian's Office to serve on a subcommittee to work on getting this project off the ground, keeping it on schedule and checking into funding.

The first step is to find out how many bad septic systems are in Hamlin and how many wells are affected. A septic tank must be at least 50 feet from a well and the lateral field must be at least 100 feet from the well. Some of the property affected will need a new source of water before anything can be done to their current septic system. All property owners in Hamlin will be contacted by the Sanitarian's office after Christmas to obtain permission to measure their property, distances to wells and lateral fields.

Steve Patterson will put together a one or two page pamphlet highlighting items discussed at this meeting including possible funding sources and these will be mailed out to Hamlin property owners.

Steve adjourned the meeting at 8:25 p.m.

After questions and discussion, Motion-Deist Second-Akers to close the hearing at 10:45 a.m. Motion-Akers Second-Deist to pass resolution 2000-51 as follows and to set Thursday, December 21, 2000 at 11:00 a.m. in the Supervisors Room in the Audubon County Courthouse as the time/place to ratify Resolution 2000-51 and to set the public hearings for a proposed Ordinance 2000-04 "An Ordinance Providing for the Division of Taxes Levied on Taxable Property in the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area, Pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa." Vote-all in favor.

Resolution 2000-51

A resolution to declare necessity and establish an urban renewal area, pursuant to Section 403.4 of the Code of Iowa and approve urban renewal plan and project for the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area

WHEREAS, as a preliminary step to exercising the authority conferred upon lowa counties by Chapter 403 of the Code of lowa, the "Urban Renewal Law", a county must adopt a resolution finding that one or more slums, blighted or economic development areas exist in the county and that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development or a combination thereof, of such area or areas is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of the county; and

WHEREAS, it has been recommended that an urban renewal area be established within the boundaries set out in Exhibit A to this Resolution; and

WHEREAS, a study has been conducted of the area identified above for the purpose of establishing the need to designate the area as being appropriate for commercial and industrial development; and

WHEREAS, the study found that sufficient need exists to warrant finding the area an economic development area; and

WHEREAS, notice of a public hearing by the Board of Supervisors on the question of establishing the area identified above as an urban renewal area and on a proposed urban renewal plan and project for the area was heretofore given in strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and the Board has conducted said hearing; and

WHEREAS, the proposed urban renewal plan and project were submitted to and approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission of the County; and

WHEREAS, copies of the urban renewal plan, notice of public hearing and notice of a consultation meeting with respect to the urban renewal plan were mailed to Audubon Community School District and the Des Moines Area Community College; the consultation meeting was held; and responses to any comments or recommendations received following the consultation meeting were made as required by law

NOW, THEREFORE, It is resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, as follows:

- Section 1. An Economic development area as defined in Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa is found to exist within the boundaries set out in Exhibit A.
- Section 2. The area identified in Section 1 hereof is hereby declared to be an urban renewal area, in conformance with the requirements of Chapter 403 of the Code of Iowa, and is hereby designated the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area.

- Section 3. The rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, development or a combination thereof, of this area is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety or welfare of the residents of Audubon County, Iowa.
 - Section 4. It is hereby determined by this Board of Supervisors as follows:
 - A. The proposed urban renewal plan conforms to the general plan of the County as a whole;
 - B. Proposed commercial and industrial development in the urban renewal area is necessary and appropriate to facilitate the proper growth and development of the County in accordance with sound planning standards and local community objectives.
- Section 5. The urban renewal plan for the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area is made a part hereof and is hereby in all respects approved in the form presented to this Board, and the proposed project for such area based upon such plan is hereby in all respects approved.
- Section 6, All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict.

EXHIBIT A Legal Description

Audubon County Urban Renewal Area

The area includes the full right-of-way of Highway 71 and the T-Bone Recreation Trail from the Audubon city limits to the Hamlin town site;

The area also includes properties located on the west side of Highway 71 which are listed on pages A-1 through A-9 of the urban renewal plan.

ORDINANCE NO. 2000-04

An Ordinance Providing for the Division of Taxes Levied on Taxable Property in the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area, Pursuant to Section 403.19 of the Code of Iowa

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to provide for the division of taxes levied on the taxable property in the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area, each year by and for the benefit of the state, city, county, school districts or other taxing districts after the effective date of this ordinance in order to create a special fund to pay the principal of and interest on loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness, including bonds proposed to be issued by Audubon County to finance projects in such area.

Section 2. Definitions. For use within this ordinance the following terms shall have the following meanings:

"County" shall mean Audubon County, Iowa.

"Urban Renewal Area" shall mean the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area, the boundaries of which are set out below, such area having been identified in the Urban Renewal Plan approved by the Board of Supervisors by resolution adopted on December 18, 2000:

The area includes the full right-of-way of Highway 71 and the T-Bone Recreation Trail from the Audubon city limits to the Hamlin town site;

AND

The area also includes properties located on the west side of Highway 71 which are listed on pages A-1 through A-9 of the urban renewal plan.

Section 3. Provisions for Division of Taxes Levied on Taxable Property in the Urban Renewal Area. After the effective date of this ordinance, the taxes levied on the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area each year by and for the benefit of the State of Iowa, the County and any city, school district or other taxing district in which the Urban Renewal Area is located, shall be divided as follows:

that portion of the taxes which would be produced by the rate at which the tax is levied each year by or for each of the taxing districts upon the total sum of the assessed value of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area, as shown on the assessment roll as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the first calendar year in which the County certifies to the County Auditor the amount of loans, advances, indebtedness, or bonds payable from the special fund referred to in paragraph (b) below, shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into the fund for the respective taxing district as taxes by or for said taxing district into which all other property taxes are paid. For the purpose of allocating taxes levied by or for any taxing district which did not include the territory in the Urban Renewal Area on the effective date of this ordinance, but to which

- (a) the territory has been annexed or otherwise included after the effective date, the assessment roll applicable to property in the annexed territory as of January 1 of the calendar year preceding the effective date of the ordinance which amends the plan for the Urban Renewal Area to include the annexed area, shall be used in determining the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the annexed area.
- (b) that portion of the taxes each year in excess of such amounts shall be allocated to and when collected be paid into a special fund of the County to pay the principal of an interest on loans, moneys advanced to or indebtedness, whether funded, assumed or otherwise, including bonds issued under the authority of Section 403.91(1), of the Code of lowa, incurred by the County to finance or refinance, in whole or in part, projects in the Urban Renewal Area, except that taxes for the payment of bonds and interest of each taxing district shall be collected against all taxable property within the taxing district without limitation by the provisions of this ordinance. Unless and until the total assessed valuation of the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area exceeds the total assessed value of the taxable property in such area as shown by the assessment roll referred to in subsection (a) of this section, all of the taxes levied and collected upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts as taxes by or for said taxing districts in the same manner as all other property taxes. When such loans, advances, indebtedness, and bonds, if any, and interest thereon, have been paid, all money thereafter received from taxes upon the taxable property in the Urban Renewal Area shall be paid into the funds for the respective taxing districts in the same manner as taxes on all other property.
- (c) the portion of taxes mentioned in subsection (b) of this section and the special fund into which that portion shall be paid may be irrevocably pledged by the county for the payment of the principal and interest on loans, advances, bonds issued under the authority of Section 403.9(1) of the Code of Iowa, or indebtedness incurred by the County to finance or refinance in whole or in part projects in the Urban Renewal Area.
- (d) As used in this section, the word "taxes" includes, but is not limited to, all levies on an ad valorem basis upon land or real property.
- Section 4. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
- Section 5. Saving Clause. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.
- Section 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
