ESTABLISHING TAX INCREMENT REVENUE FUND AND AUTHORIZING LOAN TO THAT FUND

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, established the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area ("Urban Renewal Area") and certain expenses were incurred in connection with said establishment ("Expenses"); and

WHEREAS, to make the Expenses eligible to be paid from incremental property tax revenues, it is necessary to create an internal debt;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby established, and the County Auditor is hereby directed to show in the County financial records, the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area Tax Increment Revenue Fund (the "Tax Revenue Fund"), into which all incremental property tax revenues received from the Urban Renewal Area shall be deposited.

Section 2. It is hereby directed that \$2,429.40 be advanced to the Tax Increment Fund from Audubon County – Economic Development Fund, in order to pay the Expenses. This advance shall be treated as a loan (the "Loan") to the Tax Increment Fund and shall be repaid to Audubon County, with interest at the rate of 5% per annum, out of incremental tax revenues received with respect to the Urban Renewal Area.

Payments shall be made on the Loan on or before June 1 of each year to the extent there are incremental tax revenues available for such purpose which have been allocated to or accrued in the Tax Increment Fund. Funds shall be credited first to accrued interest and then to outstanding principal. The right is hereby reserved to issue additional obligations, or to enter into additional loans, payable from the Tax Incremental Fund, which may either rank on a parity with the Loan or may have a priority over the Loan with respect to the revenues in the Tax Increment Fund.

Section 3. The Tax Increment Fund is hereby pledged to the repayment of the Loan, and a copy of this Resolution shall be filed in the Office of the County Auditor to evidence this pledge.

Section 4. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict.

ORDINANCE NO. 2001-01

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A LOCAL OPTION SALES AND SERVICES TAX APPLICABLE TO TRANSACTIONS WITHIN THE INCORPORATED AREA OF AUDUBON CITY OF AUDUBON COUNTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUDUBON COUNTY, IOWA:

Section 1. Local Option Sales and Services Tax. There is imposed a local option sales and services tax applicable to transactions with the incorporated areas of Audubon City of Audubon County.

The rate of the tax shall be one percent upon the gross receipts taxed under chapter 422, division IV, of the Code of Iowa in the following city: Audubon City

The local sales and services tax is imposed on transactions occurring on or after July 1, 2001 within the incorporated areas of Audubon City. The tax shall be collected by all persons required to collect state gross receipts taxes. However the tax shall not be imposed on the gross receipts from the sale of motor fuel or special fuel as defined in chapter 324 of the lowa Code, on the gross receipts from the rental of rooms, apartments, or sleeping quarters which are taxed under chapter 422A of the lowa Code during the period the hotel and motel tax is imposed, on the gross receipts from the sales of natural gas or electric energy in a city or county where the gross receipts are subject to a franchise fee or user fee during the period the franchise or user fee is imposed, on the gross receipts from the sale of a lottery ticket or share in a lottery game conducted pursuant to chapter 99E of the lowa Code, on the sale of self-propelled building equipment, pile drivers, motorized scaffolding, or attachments customarily drawn or attached to them, including auxiliary attachments which improve their performance, safety, operation, or efficiency and including replacement parts which are used directly and primarily by contractors, subcontractors and

builders for new construction, reconstruction, alterations, expansion or remodeling of real property or structures under the Iowa Code sections 422B.8, 422E.3, subsections 2 and 3, and on the sale or rental of tangible personal property described in section 422.45, subsections 26 and 27 of the Iowa Code.

All applicable provisions of the appropriate sections of chapter 422, division IV, of the Iowa Code are adopted by reference.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication provided by law.

Willcoxon states this particular project is very grant promising because of all the cities interested in participating. Region XII and Regional Water will return in a month with more information, more accurate figures and updated grant information.

Ted Ely, MH/CPC Coordinator, presented New Hope Village and County's Program Participation Agreement previously discussed. Motion-Venteicher Second-Alt to approve the New Hope Village and County's Program Participation Agreement. Vote-all in favor. Also reviewed 28E Agreement with Cherokee MHI transportation. WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, established the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area ("Urban Renewal Area") and certain expenses were incurred in connection with said establishment ("Expenses"); and

WHEREAS, to make the Expenses eligible to be paid from incremental property tax revenues, it is necessary to create an internal debt;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, lowa, as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby established, and the County Auditor is hereby directed to show in the County financial records, the Audubon County Urban Renewal Area Tax Increment Revenue Fund (the "Tax Increment Fund"), into which all incremental property tax revenues received from the Urban Renewal Area shall be deposited.

Section 2. It is hereby directed that \$2,429.40 be advanced to the Tax Increment Fund from Audubon County – Economic Development Fund, in order to pay the Expenses. This advance shall be treated as a loan (the "Loan") to the Tax Increment Fund and shall be repaid to Audubon County, with interest at the rate of 5% per annum, out of incremental tax revenues received with respect to the Urban Renewal Area.

Payments shall be made on the Loan on or before June 1 of each year to the extent there are incremental tax revenues available for such purpose which have been allocated to or accrued in the Tax Increment Fund. Funds shall be credited first to accrued interest and then to outstanding principal. The right is hereby reserved to issue additional obligations, or to enter into additional loans, payable from the Tax Increment Fund, which may either rank on a parity with the Loan or may have a priority over the Loan with respect to the revenues in the Tax Increment Fund.

Section 3. The Tax Increment Fund is hereby pledged to the repayment of the Loan, and a copy of this Resolution shall be filed in the Office of the County Auditor to evidence this pledge.

Section 4. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict.

COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 2001-02

Section 1 Title

On-Site Wastewater Management District Ordinance

Section 2 Application of Ordinance

The procedure in this ordinance shall be used by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, lowa for the establishment and operation of on-site wastewater management districts in this county. Such districts shall be intended for unincorporated population centers within the County. Such districts shall be proposed by the Audubon County Board of Health and the establishment be approved by the Audubon County Board of Supervisors.

Section 3 The purposes of this ordinance are:

- A. To ensure the proper operation of all existing and future on-site wastewater treatment systems in order to protect the public health, water quality, and the environment.
- B. To allow for the use of the more high maintenance, innovative, or alternative onsite wastewater treatment systems where "conventional" on-site systems are not appropriate.

Section 4 Definitions

"On-site wastewater treatment systems" means any works or facilities used to collect, treat, reclaim, or dispose of domestic wastewater on-site from individual dwelling or building or a cluster of two or more dwellings or buildings.

A "conventional wastewater treatment system" means any septic tank with a non-pressurized subsurface soil absorption field or bed.

The "Administration" means the County Board of Health and the County Environmental Health Sanitarian.

Section 5 District Boundaries

The on-site wastewater management district will be responsible for the supervision and approval of the design, construction, repair, operation, and maintenance of all on-site wastewater treatment systems within the established district.

Section 6 Extension of District

Amending Section 5 may extend the boundaries of the on-site wastewater management district established on passage of this ordinance.

Section 7 Administration

Upon establishment of the district, the County Board of Health shall assume the powers and duties provided under this ordinance. The County Sanitarian shall serve to administer the district.

Section 8 Management Program

- A. The Administration shall develop a detailed management program for the district.
 - B. The Administration shall also develop reasonable rules and regulations necessary to implement the purposes of the ordinance.
 - C. The adoption of the management program and the rules and regulations shall be by resolution of the County Board of Health

Section 9 Powers and Duties

The Administration may:

A. Collect, treat, reclaim and dispose of wastewater without degrading the water quality within or outside of the district.

- B. Design, monitor, inspect, and maintain on-site wastewater treatment systems within the district in a manner which will protect public health, promote water quality, prevent pollution, and abate nuisances.
- C. Employ and terminate the employment of those employees necessary to operate and maintain the detailed management plan, and contract with any firm or agency to perform necessary services.
- D. Incur indebtedness and collect assessments for improvements where appropriate, as provided by State law, to implement the purposes of this ordinance.

Section 10 Inspections

The Administration may, with or without the consent of the owner or occupant, come onto one's property in the district on which a wastewater treatment system is located for the purpose of inspecting the system, and securing samples or records. If the owner or occupant refuses admittance there to, or if prior to such refusal, the authorized representative demonstrates the necessity for a warrant, the authorized representative may make application under oath or affirmation, to the district court for issuance of a search warrant.

If during the inspection, repairs are deemed necessary, the property owner will be sent a repair order stating specifically what repairs are required. The property owner will be required to have all problems repaired at their own expenses within a specified time period.

Section 11 Costs

The administration may establish a service fee schedule to recover the operating and administration costs of the district. Failure to pay a service fee when due shall create a lien against the property as provided by State law.

Section 12 Enforcement

A violation of a rule adopted pursuant to Section 8 of this ordinance shall constitute a simple misdemeanor.

Section 13 Severability Clause

If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 14 When effective

This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

Precinct 1 – Shall consist of Viola Township, Cameron Township, Lincoln Township and Gray Corporation, inclusively.

Precinct 2 – Shall consist of Douglas Township, Melville Township, Sections One (1) through Twenty-One (21) of Leroy Township lying outside the Corporation limits of the City of Audubon, and that portion of the City of Audubon, described as follows: all that part of the City of Audubon lying north and northeasterly of the center line of Chicago Street from the point of its intersection with the east Corporation line to its intersection with the center line of Washington Street, and east and northeasterly of the center line of Washington Street from its intersection with Chicago Street to its intersection with the center line of Broadway Street, and north and northeasterly of the center line of Broadway Street from its intersection with the center line of Washington Street to its junction with the center line of West Broadway Street, and north of the center line of West Broadway Street and center of West Broadway projected west to the Corporation line and that portion of the incorporated City of Audubon lying within Section Twenty-two (22).

Precinct 3 – Shall consist of Sections Twenty-two (22) through Thirty-six (36) of Leroy Township lying outside the Corporation limits of the City of Audubon, and that portion of the City of Audubon described as follows: all of that part of the City of Audubon lying south and southeasterly of the center line of Chicago Street from the point of it intersection with the east Corporation line to its intersection with the center line of Washington Street, and west and southwesterly of the center line of Washington Street to its intersection with the center line of Chicago Street to its intersection with the center line of Broadway, and south and southwesterly of the center line of Broadway Street from its intersection with Washington Street to its junction with the center line of West Broadway projected west to the Corporation line and that portion of Hamlin Township lying north and northeasterly of the center line of US Highway 44 and including that portion described as the unincorporated Village of Hamlin.

Precinct 4 - Shall consist of Sharon Township and Kimballton Corporation, inclusively.

Precinct 5 – Shall consist of Oakfield Township and Brayton Corporation, including that portion of Brayton Corporation lying within the boundaries of Exira Township.

Precinct 6 – Shall consist of Audubon Township, Greeley Township, Exira Corporation and Exira Township, excluding that portion of said Exira Township lying within the Corporation limits of the Town of Brayton, and that part of Hamlin Township lying south and southwesterly of the center line of US Highway 44 and excluding that part described as the unincorporated Village of Hamlin lying within the boundaries of Hamlin Township.

The County Auditor is hereby directed to record the foregoing in his/her records, and the Election Commissioner is hereby directed to correct his/her records and, in accordance with the provision of Chapter 49 of the Code of Iowa, is further directed to publish notice of the foregoing change in the official newspaper of Audubon County for each of three (3) consecutive weeks, the last to be made at least thirty (30) days before the next general election.

AUDUBON COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. #2001-05 PERTAINING TO THE USE OF THE ROAD RIGHT-OF-WAY

SECTION 1: Purpose. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish a policy, procedure, and penalty for the improper use of County Road Right-of-Way.

SECTION 2: Definitions. For use in this ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

- 1. "road right-of-way" shall mean the area in which the County holds an easement for roadway purposes on secondary roads within Audubon County.
- 2. "improper use of road right-of-way" shall mean those activities specified in Section 5 of this ordinance or any other use of the road Right-of-Way not specifically provided for by law.
- 3. "Board" shall mean the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County.
- 4. "Engineer" shall mean the County Engineer of Audubon County.
- 5. "County" shall be Audubon County or its authorized representative.

SECTION 3: Powers of the Board. All jurisdiction and control of the items provided for in this ordinance shall rest with the Board.

SECTION 4: Authority. The Board is empowered under the authority of Chapter 319, Section 13 of the 2001 Code of lowa to remove obstructions from the right-of-way, and this ordinance shall in no way limit the County's rights, powers, and responsibilities as set forth in said chapter. This ordinance shall not prevent the landowner from harvesting, from July 15 to September 1, the grass grown on the road right-of-way along the landowners land as provided for in Chapter 317, Section 11, of the 2001 Code of lowa except for vegetation maintained for highway purposes as part of an integrated roadside management plan which is consistent with the objectives in Section 314.22.

SECTION 5: Improper Uses of Right-of-Ways. It shall be unlawful for any person to use County right-of-ways for:

- 1. Grazing of animals
- 2. Row crop farming
- 3. Storage of hay
- 4. Spraying or mowing of posted areas
- 5. Disposal of trash or waste and/or burning of same
- 6. Soil borrow area
- 7. Storage/disposal of equipment
- 8. Any obstruction temporary or permanent that would constitute a dangerous hazard

SECTION 6: Notice to Cease. The County shall provide a written Notice to Cease sent by certified mail to landowners and tenants found to be using the right-of-way in violation of this ordinance.

SECTION 7: Correction and Removal. The County shall allow 48 hours from the date of receipt of the Notice to Cease for removal of the objects from or the termination of the improper use of the road right-of-way. Objects shall be removed in a suitable manner as to not cause damage to the right-of-way.

SECTION 8: Penalty. It shall be considered a simple misdemeanor should the landowner or tenant fail to stop the use or remove the crops or other objects within the time specified. Each and every day after the notice has been given, in accordance with the ordinance, shall constitute a separate offense.

WHEREAS the citizens of Audubon County would be required to travel additional miles to obtain court services and pay additional taxes to fund the additional travel by public officials, and

WHEREAS the Clerks of Court were for many years county elected officials, and court services were provided for each county's citizens by a County Clerk who remitted criminal fine moneys collected to the county, and

WHEREAS the Clerks became state court employees, and the finesse began to go to the State, and WHEREAS it is in the interest of Audubon County citizens to be provided court services efficiently and locally, and it appears that the State Judicial Branch is not able or willing to budget and provide for adequate court services to rural citizens; and county government is better able to provide said services to county citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED The Audubon County Board of Supervisors respectfully requests that the legislature amend the *Code of Iowa* to move the offices of Clerks of the District Court back to county control, and to provide that the criminal fine moneys collected by the Clerk be again remitted to the counties to fund the Clerks of the District Court.
