When burning brush cleared from road ditches and county property, Audubon County employees must sometimes add an accelerant to the brush to get the fire burning efficiently. When this is necessary, the following precautions shall be taken:

- 1. Ensure vehicles are not parked within 50 feet of the brush pile.
- 2. Gasoline will NOT be used as an accelerant.
- 3. An accelerant should be added to the brush pile prior to lighting the fire.

When it is necessary to add an accelerant to an already burning fire additional precautions shall be taken:

- 1. Only add an accelerant from the upwind side of the burn pile.
- 2. The method of adding an accelerant to the fire shall not have the potential to create a trail of fuel from the fire to a person, county equipment, or other valuable property.

Penalties for violations of this policy shall be as per the Safety Policy for Audubon County Secondary Roads Department and/or the Audubon County, Iowa, Employee Information Handbook. Passed this 21st day of January, 2002.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A PROCUREMENT POLICY

WHEREAS: Audubon County, Iowa (to be henceforth referred to as the County), hereby adopts and implements the following procurement policy:

PROCUREMENT POLICY

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that sound business judgment is utilized in all procurement transactions and that supplies, equipment, construction, and services are obtained efficiently and economically and in compliance with applicable federal law and executive orders and to ensure that all procurement transactions will be conducted in a manner that provides full and open competition. Application

This policy applies to the procurement of all supplies, equipment, construction, and services of and for the County related to the implementation and administration of Community Development Block Grants. All procurement will be done in accordance with 24 CFR; Part 85. Policy

١. Methods of Procurement

Procurement under grants shall be made by one of the following methods, as described herein; (a) small purchase procedures; (b) sealed bids (formal advertising); (c) competitive proposals; (d) non-competitive proposals.

A. Small purchase procedures are relatively simple and informal procurement methods that sound and appropriate for a procurement of services, supplies, or other property, costing in aggregate not more than \$25,000. If small purchase procedures are used for a procurement under a grant, price or rate quotations shall be obtained from an adequate number of qualified sources to determine the most advantageous provider.

Board of Supervisors Meeting March 18, 2002 (continued)

- B. In sealed bids (formal advertising), sealed bids are publicly solicited and a firm fixed price contract (lump sum or unit price) is awarded to the responsible bidder whose bid conforming with all of the material terms and conditions of the invitation for bids, is lowest in price. The sealed bids methods is the preferred method for procuring construction.
- 1. In order for formal advertising to be feasible, the following conditions must be present:
 - (a) A complete, adequate and realistic specifications or purchased description;
 - (b) two or more responsible suppliers are willing and able to compete effectively for the business; and
- (c) the procurement lends itself to a firm fixed price contract, and selection of a successful bidder can appropriately be made principally on the basis of price.
- 2. When the formal advertising is used for procurement under a grant, the following requirements shall apply:
 - (a) The invitation for bids will be publicly advertised and bids shall be solicited from an adequate number of known suppliers.
 - (b) The invitation for bids, including specifications and pertinent attachments, shall clearly define the items or services needed in order for the bidders to properly respond to the invitation.
 - (c) All bids shall be opened publicly at the time and place stated in the invitation for bids.
 - (d) A firm fixed price contract award shall be made by written notice to that responsible bidder whose bid, conforming to the invitation for bids, is lowest. Where specified in the bidding documents, factors such as discounts, transportation costs and life cycle costs shall be considered in determining which bid is lowest. Payment discounts may only be used to determine low bid when prior experience of the County indicated that such discounts may only be used to determine low bid when prior experience of the County indicated that such discounts are generally taken.
 - (e) Any or all bids may be rejected when there are sound documented business reasons in the best interest of the program.
- C. In competitive proposals, proposals are requested from a number of sources and the Request for Proposal is publicized. Negotiations are normally conducted with more than one of the sources submitting offers, and either a fixed price or cost reimbursable type contract is awarded, as appropriate for the use of formal advertising. If the competitive proposals method is used for procurement under a grant, the following requirements shall apply:
 - 1. The Request for Proposal shall be publicized and identify all evaluation factors and their relative importance. Any person to publicized request for proposals shall be honored to the maximum extent practical.
 - 2. Requests for proposals shall be solicited from an adequate number of gualified sources.
 - The County shall provide mechanisms for technical evaluation of the proposals received, determinations of responsible offers for the purpose of written or oral discussions, and selection for contract award.
 - 4. Awards will be made to the responsible offerer whose proposal will be most advantageous to the procuring party, with price and other factors considered. Unsuccessful offers will be promptly notified in writing.
 - 5. The County/Agency may utilize competitive negotiation procedures for procurement of architectural/engineering (A/E) professional services, whereby competitor's qualifications are selected, subject to negotiation of fair and reasonable compensation. The methods, where price is not used as a selection factor, can only be used in the procurement of A/E professional services. It cannot be used to procure other types of sources (e.g. administration professional services) even though A/E firms are a potential source to perform the proposed effort.
- D. Noncompetitive proposals are procured through solicitation of a proposal from only one source, or after solicitation of a number of sources, competition is determined inadequate. Noncompetitive proposals may be used only when the award of a contract is not feasible under small purchase, sealed bids (formal advertising), or competitive proposals. Circumstances under which a contract may be awarded by noncompetitive proposals are limited to the following:
 - 1. The item is available from only a single source:
 - 2. After solicitation of a number of sources; competition is determined inadequate;

- 3. A public urgency or emergency when the urgency for the requirement will not permit a delay incident to competitive solicitation; and
- 4. The awarding agency (IDED) authorizes noncompetitive proposals. (Sole source procurement for supplies, equipment, construction, and services valued at \$25,000 or more must have prior approval of the lowa Department of Economic Development.)
- E. The County will provide, to the greatest extent possible, that contracts be awarded to qualified Small and minority firms, women's business enterprises, and labor surplus area firms whenever they are potential sources.
- F. Any other method of procurement must have prior approval from the Iowa Department of Economic Development.

II Contract Pricing

- A. The cost plus a percentage of cost and percentage of construction cost method of contracting shall not be used.
- B. The County shall perform some form of cost/price analysis for every procurement action, including modifications or change orders.
- The County shall maintain records sufficient to detail the significant history of procurement, including the rationale for the method of procurement, selection of contract type, contractor selection or rejection, and the basis for the contract price.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A RESIDENTIAL ANTI-DISPLACEMENT AND RELOCATION ASSISTANCE PLAN (RARA) under Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended.

WHEREAS: Audubon County, Iowa

Henceforth referred to as the County, will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate-income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate-income housing in connection with an activity assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, in accordance with the requirements described in 24 CFR 570.496(c)(1).

All replacement housing will be provided within three years after the commencement of the demolition or conversion. Before entering into a contract committing the County to provide funds for an activity that will directly result in demolition or conversion, the County will make public by publication in a paper of general circulation and submit to the lowa Department of Economic Development the following information in writing:

- 1. A description of the proposed activity;
- 2. The exact location on a map (including addresses) and the exact number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate-income dwelling units as a direct result of the essential activity;
- 3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
- 4. The exact location on a map and exact number of dwelling units that will be provided as replacement dwelling units. If such data are not available at the time of the general submission, the County will identify the general location on an area map and the approximate number of dwelling units by size and provide information identifying the specific location and number of dwelling units by size as soon as it is available;
- 5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of replacement dwelling units;
- 6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain a low/moderate-income dwelling unit for at least ten (10) years from the date of initial occupancy, and:
- 7. Information demonstrating that any proposed replacement of dwelling units with smaller dwelling units is consistent with the housing needs of low/moderate-income households in the jurisdiction.

Audubon County, Courthouse, 318 Leroy Street #2, Audubon, Iowa 50025, telephone (712)563-2584 is responsible for tracking the replacement of housing and ensuring that it is provided within the required period.

Audubon County is responsible for ensuring requirements are met for notification and provision of relocation assistance, as described in CFR570.496(a)(c)(2), to any low/moderate-income person displaced by the demolition of any dwelling unit or the conversion of a low/moderate-income dwelling unit to another use in connection with an assisted activity.

Consistent with the goals and objectives of activities assisted under the Act, the County will take the following steps to minimize the displacement of persons from their homes:

- 1. Evaluate housing codes and rehabilitation standards in reinvestment areas to prevent their placing undue financial burden on established owners or tenants of multi-family buildings.
- 2. Establish facilities to house persons who must be relocated temporarily during rehabilitation.
- 3. Adopt policies, which protest tenants from developers that would rehabilitate housing in such a manner that it would no longer be affordable to low/moderate-income families or individuals.
- 4. Establish counseling centers to provide homeowners and renters with information on the assistance available to help them remain in their neighborhood in the face of revitalization or rehabilitation efforts.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the County will provide relocation assistance as described by 49 CFR 24, Subplots C, D, and E or 24 CRF 570.496a(E)(2), whichever is applicable, to each low/moderateincome dwelling to another use as a direct result of assisted activities.

- <u>02-1.4.</u> When Effective. This ordinance shall be effective after its final passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE 2002-3

AN ORDINANCE ESTABISHING A LOCAL OPTION SALES AND SERVICES TAX APPLICABLE TO TRANSACTIONS WITHIN THE INCORPORATED AREAS OF THE CITIES OF EXIRA AND KIMBALLTON AND IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA IN THE COUNTY OF AUDUBON, STATE OF IOWA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUDUBON COUNTY, IOWA:

Section 1. Local Option Sales and Services Tax. There is imposed a local option sales and services tax applicable to transactions with the incorporated areas of the Cities of Exira and Kimballton and the unincorporated area of Audubon County, Iowa.

The rate of the tax shall be one (1) percent upon the gross receipts taxed under Chapter 422, Division IV, of the lowa Code in the Cities of Exira and Kimballton and the unincorporated area of Audubon County.

The local sales and services tax is imposed on transactions occurring on or after January 1, 2003, within the incorporated areas of the Cities of Exira and Kimballton and the unincorporated area of Audubon County. The tax shall be collected by all persons required to collect state gross receipts taxes. However, the tax shall no be imposed on the gross receipts from the sale of motor fuel or special fuel as defined in Chapter 324 of the Iowa Code, on the gross receipts from the rental of rooms, apartments, or sleeping quarters which are taxed under Chapter 422A of the lowa Code during the period the hotel and motel tax is imposed, on the gross receipts from the sale of natural gas or electric energy in a city or county where the gross receipts are subject to a franchise fee or user fee during the period the franchise or user fee is imposed, on the gross receipts from the sale of a lottery ticket or share in a lottery game conducted pursuant to chapter 99E of the lowa Code, and on the sale or self-propelled building equipment, pile drivers, motorized scaffolding, or attachments customarily drawn or attached to them, including auxiliary attachments which improve their performance, safety, operation, or efficiency and including replacement parts which are used directly and primarily by contractors, subcontractors and builders for new construction, reconstruction, alterations, expansion or remodeling of real property or structures under the lowa Code sections 422B.8, 422E.3, subsections 2 and 3, and on the sale or rental of tangible personal property described in section 422.45, subsections 26 and 27 of the Iowa Code

All applicable provisions of the appropriate sections of Chapter 422, Division IV, of the Iowa Code are adopted be reference.

Section 2. <u>Effective Date</u>, This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
