WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in Iowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix:

RESOLUTION 04-03 AUDUBON COUNTY NO SPRAY POLICY

Policy Statement

To provide all landowners/tenants within Audubon County the option of controlling noxious weeds without herbicide along the county right-of-way adjacent to the land they control.

Upon requesting that Audubon County not apply any herbicides in the right-of-way next to property which they control, the landowner/tenant is required to assume the responsibility for vegetation control in this area. The vegetation required to be controlled includes all weeds on the lowa noxious weed list and falls under The lowa Weed Law Chapter 317 of the Code Of lowa for control of noxious weeds.

Mowing or hand-pulling will be considered as acceptable methods of control. For mowing or pulling to be a viable weed control option, it shall be done as often as necessary to control noxious weeds in the right-of-way to prevent the spread, growth, or scattering of the weed seed. The weed control time lines will be the same as the Audubon County weed policy.

In consideration of the landowner/tenant's desire and willingness to perform weed control on the applicable right-of-way, Audubon County will refrain from spraying in those locations properly designated.

If upon inspection by the County Weed Commissioner, the vegetation is found to be improperly controlled by non-chemical means, Audubon County reserves the right to spray the affected area. The area requested not to be sprayed will then be returned to the regular Roadside spraying program.

For organic purposes, any required buffers will not include county right-of-way.

Policy Rules

Landowners/Tenants shall:

- 1.) Request and designate the NO SPRAY areas annually prior to May 1st of each year.

ORDINANCE NO. 2004-01

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A SCHOOL INFRASTRUCTURE LOCAL OPTION SALES AND SERVICES TAX APPLICABLE TO TRANSACTIONS WITHIN AUDUBON COUNTY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUDUBON COUNTY, IOWA:

Section 1. <u>School Infrastructure Local Option Sales and Services Tax.</u> There is imposed a school infrastructure local option sales and services tax applicable to transactions within Audubon County.

The rate of the tax shall be one percent upon the gross receipts taxed under chapter 422E – School Local Option Tax, in the following – Adair, Anita, Atlantic, Audubon, Coon Rapids-Bayard, Elk Horn-Kimballton, Exira, Guthrie-Center and Manning Community School Districts of Audubon County, Iowa. The revenue shall be used by each school district for school infrastructure as defined by Code of Iowa, 422E.1 or as restricted by ballot language of the March 30, 2004 election which authorized the tax.

The school infrastructure local sales and services tax is imposed on transactions occurring on or after July 1, 2004. The tax will be in effect for a period of ten years until and including June 30, 2014, within Audubon County. The revenue thus generated shall be distributed by the Department of Revenue and Finance as per state law to the following school districts within Audubon County: Adair, Anita, Atlantic, Audubon, Coon Rapids-Bayard, Elk Horn-Kimballton, Exira, Guthrie-Center and Manning School Districts. All persons required to collect state gross tax receipts taxes shall collect the tax pursuant to lowa Code section 422E.3 for school infrastructure local option sales and services tax.

All applicable provisions of the appropriate sections of Chapter 422, division IV, of the Iowa Code are adopted by reference.

Section 2. <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication provided by law.

AUDUBON COUNTY OFFICE OF THE COUNTY ENGINEER POLICY RELATING TO SEAL COAT ROADS

INTENT

The intent of this policy is to assure uniform treatment of all County residents in the determination of which County roads the County will participate in seal coating.

BACKGROUND

The Audubon County Road Department is responsible for the care, maintenance and replacement of approximately 800 miles of road and some 220 bridge structures. In addition, there are literally thousands of culvert drainage structures. Because of the substantial costs of maintaining this road system and the limited, if not diminishing funds available, some services previously provided are no longer economically feasible to continue.

POLICY

REALIZING that funds to maintain the overall county road system are limited; and, REALIZING that there is a substantial initial and annual cost associated with maintaining roads therefore; BE IT RESOLVED that the Audubon County Board of Supervisors has adopted the following policy:

- 1. Audubon County will only participate in seal coat preparation and application on county/city corporate line roads. Any and all requests to expand the existing county/city corporate line seal coat program must be made to the county engineer and will be reviewed by the Board of Supervisors on a case-by-case base.
- Audubon County recognizes the two unincorporated communities of Ross and Hamlin and will
 continue at this time to maintain their seal coat surfacing. In addition, the existing seal coat surface
 to the county yard on 215th Street east of U.S. Highway 71 will be maintained this time.
- 3. Private participation of seal coat application beyond corporate limits on the county road system may be permitted. All parties granted permission for such private participation would enter into a

seal coat agreement with the County. The resolution adopted April 21, 1994, will serve as the guideline.
