AREA SERVICE "C" ROAD MAINTENANCE ORDINANCE Audubon County Ordinance No. <u>05-01</u>

Title: An Ordinance Establishing the Area Service "C" Road Classification in Audubon County, Iowa. Be It Enacted by the Board of Supervisors, Audubon County, Iowa:

Section 1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this ordinance is to classify certain roads on the area service system in the county as Area Service "C" roads so as to provide for a reduced level of maintenance effort and restricted access, pursuant to lowa Code Section 309.57.

Section 2. **DEFINITIONS**

For use in this ordinance, certain terms or words used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows:

- "Area Service System" include those public roads outside of municipalities not otherwise classified.
 - a. "Area Service System "A" roads shall be maintained in conformance with applicable state statutes.
 - b. "Area Service System "C" roads shall not require standards maintenance equal to farm to market, or area service system A roads. Area Service System C roads shall not mean what is construed in the normal sense as a driveway or private lane to a farm building or dwelling.
- 2. "Board" shall mean the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County.
- 3. "Engineer" shall mean the County Engineer of Audubon County.
- "County" shall mean Audubon County.

Section 3. HOW ESTABLISHED

- A. RESOLUTION: Roads may only be classified as Area Service "C" by resolution of the Board. The resolution shall specify the level of maintenance effort and the persons who will have access rights to the road.
- B. NOTICE OF ACTION: Before the Board may take action to establish an Area Service "C" road, a notice of the proposed action, including the location of the Area Service "C" road and the time and place of the meeting at which the Board proposes to take action on the petition, shall be published as provided by law.
- C. BOARD ACTION: At the meeting, the Board shall receive oral or written comments from any resident or property owner of the county.
 - After all comments have been received and considered, the Board, at that meeting or date to which it is adjourned, may take action after consultation with the County Engineer.

Section 4. ACCESS

Access to any Area Service "C" road shall be restricted by means of a gate or other barrier, as determined by the County Engineer. The gate shall be purchased and installed by the County, and maintained by the adjoining landowners. If not so maintained, the County may remove the gate.

Section 5. SIGNS

Page 14

Board of Supervisors Meeting February 7, 2005

Area Service "C" roads shall have signs conforming to the Iowa Signing Manual Per 761 Iowa Administrative Code (IAC) <u>Chapter 130</u>. The signs shall be installed and maintained by the County at all access points to the Area Service "C" roads from other public roads to warn the public that access is limited.

Section 6. TRESPASS

Entering an Area Service "C" road without justification after being notified or requested to abstain from entering or to remove or vacate the road by any person lawfully allowed access shall be a trespass as defined in lowa Code Section 716.7.

Section 7. RECLASSIFICATION

A road with an Area Service "C" classification shall retain the classification until such time as a petition for reclassification is submitted to the Board. The petition shall be signed by one or more adjoining landowners. The Board shall approve or deny the request for reclassification within 60 days of receipt of the petition.

Section 8. POWERS OF THE BOARD

All jurisdiction and control over Area Service "C" roads shall rest with the Board, pursuant to the Iowa Code Section 309:57

Section 9. **EXEMPTION FROM LIABILITY**

As provided in Iowa Code Section 309.57, the County and officers, agents and employees of the County are not liable for injury to any person or for damage to any vehicle or equipment which occurs approximately as a result of the maintenance of a road which is classified as Area Service "C", if the road has been maintained to the level of maintenance effort described in the establishing resolution.

Section 10. REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 11. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 12. WHEN EFFECTIVE

This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication, as provided by law Passed this 7th day of February, 2005.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 331.402(3) and 331.443 of the Code of Iowa, notice duly published and hearing held thereon, the County has heretofore determined to contract indebtedness and enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") in the principal amount of \$1,450,000 to provide funds to pay the cost, to that extent, of making repairs to the elevator and other areas of the Courthouse; acquiring equipment for the Courthouse; acquiring a geographic computer data base system; acquiring voting equipment; and refunding the Optional Series 1996 Notes;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, as follows: Section 1. The County hereby determines to enter into a loan agreement with Ruan Securities Corporation, Des Moines, Iowa, as lender (the "Lender"), in substantially the form attached hereto, providing for a loan to the County in the principal amount of \$1,450,000, for the purpose set forth in the preamble hereof.

The Chairperson of the Board and the County Auditor are hereby authorized and directed to sign the Loan Agreement on behalf of the County, and the Loan Agreement is hereby approved.

Section 2. General Obligation County Purpose and Refunding Notes, Series 2005, in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,450,000, are hereby authorized to be issued in evidence of the obligation of the County under the Loan Agreement, in the denomination of \$5,000 each, or any integral multiple thereof, dated March 15, 2005, maturing on June 1 in each of the years in the principal amounts and bearing interest at the respective rates as follows:

Bankers Trust Company, N.A., Des Moines, Iowa, is hereby designated as the Registrar and Paying Agent for the Notes and may be hereinafter referred to as the "Registrar" or the "Paying Agent".

The County reserves the right to prepay part or all of the Notes maturing in each of the years 2010 to 2013, inclusive, prior to and in any order of maturity on June 1, 2009, or on any date thereafter upon terms of par and accrued interest. If less than all of the Notes of any like maturity are to be redeemed, the particular part of those Notes to be redeemed shall be selected by the Registrar by lot. The Notes may be called in one or more units of \$5,000. If less than the entire principal amount of any Note in a denomination of more than \$5,000 is to be redeemed, the Registrar will issue and deliver to the registered owner thereof, upon surrender of such original Note, a new Note or Notes, in any authorized denomination, in a total aggregate principal

amount equal to the unredeemed balance of the original Note. Notice of such redemption as aforesaid identifying the Note or Notes (or portion thereof) to be redeemed shall be mailed by certified mail to the registered owners thereof at the addresses shown on the County's registration books not less than 30 nor more than 60 days prior to such redemption date. All of such Notes as to which the County reserves and exercises the right of redemption and as to which notice as aforesaid shall have been given and for the redemption of which funds are duly provided, shall cease to bear interest on the redemption date.

All of the interest on the Notes shall be payable December 1, 2005, and semiannually thereafter on the first day of June and December in each year. Payment of interest on the Notes shall be made to the registered owners appearing on the registration books of the County at the close of business on the fifteenth day of the month next preceding the interest payment date and shall be paid by check or draft mailed to the registered owners at the addresses shown on such registration books. Principal of the Notes shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America to the registered owners or their legal representatives upon presentation and surrender of the Note or Notes at the office of the Paying Agent.

The Notes shall be executed on behalf of the County with the official manual or facsimile signature of the Chairperson of the Board and attested with the official manual or facsimile signature of the County Auditor and shall have the County's seal impressed or printed thereon, and shall be fully registered Notes without interest coupons. In case any officer whose signature or the facsimile of whose signature appears on the Notes shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of the Notes, such signature or such facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if such officer had remained in office until delivery.

The Notes shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose until the Certificate of Authentication thereon shall have been signed by the Registrar.

The Notes shall be fully registered as to principal and interest in the names of the owners on the registration books of the County kept by the Registrar, and after such registration, payment of the principal thereof and interest thereon shall be made only to the registered owners or their legal representatives or assigns. Each Note shall be transferable without cost to the registered owner thereof only upon the registration books of the County upon presentation to the Registrar, together with either a written instrument of transfer satisfactory to the Registrar or the assignment form thereon completed and duly executed by the registered owner or the duly authorized attorney for such registered owner.

The record and identity of the owners of the Notes shall be kept confidential as provided by Section 22.7 of the Code of Iowa.

Section 3. Notwithstanding anything above to the contrary, the Notes shall be issued initially as Depository Bonds, with one fully registered Note for each maturity date, in principal amounts equal to the amount of principal maturing on each such date, and registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee for The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"). On original issue, the Notes shall be deposited with DTC for the purpose of maintaining a book-entry system for recording the ownership interests of its participants and the transfer of those interests among its participants (the "Participants"). In the event that DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the Notes or the County determines not to continue the book-entry system for recording ownership interests in the Notes with DTC, the County will discontinue the book-entry system with DTC. If the County does not select another qualified securities depository to replace DTC (or a successor depository) in order to continue a book-entry system, the County will register and deliver replacement Notes in the form of fully registered certificates, in authorized denominations of \$5,000 or integral multiples of \$5,000, in accordance with instructions from Cede & Co., as nominee for DTC. In the event that the County identifies a qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the County will register and deliver replacement Notes, fully registered in the name of such depository, or its nominee, in the denominations as set forth above, as reduced from time to time prior to maturity in connection with redemptions or retirements by call or payment, and in such event, such depository will then maintain the book-entry system for recording ownership interests in the Notes.

Ownership interest in the Notes may be purchased by or through Participants. Such Participants and the persons for whom they acquire interests in the Notes as nominees will not receive certificated Notes, but each such Participant will receive a credit balance in the records of DTC in the amount of such Participant's interest in the Notes, which will be confirmed in accordance with DTC's standard procedures. Each such person for

DTC will receive payments from the County, to be remitted by DTC to the Participants for subsequent disbursement to the Beneficial Owners. The ownership interest of each Beneficial Owner in the Notes will be recorded on the records of the Participants whose ownership interest will be recorded on a computerized book-entry system kept by DTC.

When reference is made to any action which is required or permitted to be taken by the Beneficial Owners, such reference shall only relate to those permitted to act (by statute, regulation or otherwise) on behalf of such Beneficial Owners for such purposes. When notices are given, they shall be sent by the County to DTC, and DTC shall forward (or cause to be forwarded) the notices to the Participants so that the Participants can forward the same to the Beneficial Owners.

Beneficial Owners will receive written confirmations of their purchases from the Participants acting on behalf of the Beneficial Owners detailing the terms of the Notes acquired. Transfers of ownership interests in the Notes will be accomplished by book entries made by DTC and the Participants who act on behalf of the Beneficial Owners. RESOLUTION FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF AREA SERVICE "C" ROADS Audubon County Resolution No. 2005-23

WHEREAS, Audubon County desires to classify certain roads on the area service system in the County to provide for a minimal level of maintenance and access by means of a gate or barrier; and

WHEREAS, the County, after consultation with the County Engineer, has the authority to specify certain roads within the County as Area Service "C" roads pursuant to Iowa Code Section 309.57; and

WHEREAS, the only persons who will have access rights to the roads shall be:

- (1) the owner, lessee, or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,
- (2) The agent or employee of the owner, lessee or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,
- (3) any peace officer,
- (4) any magistrate,
- (5) any public employee whose duty it is to supervise the use or perform maintenance of the road.
- (6) any agent or employee of any utility located upon the road.

WHEREAS, the minimal level of maintenance will be as follows:

- 1. Blading. Blading or dragging will not be performed on a regular basis.
- 2. <u>Snow and Ice Removal</u>. Snow and ice will not be removed, nor will the road surface be sanded or salted on a regular basis.
- 3. <u>Signing</u>. Except for load limit posting for bridges, signing shall not be continued or provided. <u>ALL AREA SERVICE LEVEL C ROADS SHALL BE IDENTIFIED WITH A SIGN AT ALL POINTS OF ACCESS TO WARN THE PUBLIC OF THE LOWER LEVEL OF MAINTENANCE.</u>
- 4. <u>Weeds, Brush and Trees.</u> Mowing or spraying weeds, cutting brush and tree removal will not be performed on a regular basis. Adequate sight distances will not be maintained.
- 5. <u>Structures</u>. Bridges and culverts may not be maintained to carry legal loads. Upon failure or loss, the replacement structure will be appropriate for the traffic thereon.
- 6. Road Surfacing. There will be no surfacing materials applied to Area Service System C Roads on a regular basis.
- 7. Shoulders. Shoulders will not be maintained on a regular basis.
- 8. <u>Crown</u>. A crown will not be maintained on a regular basis.
- 9. Repairs. There will be no road repair on a regular basis.
- 10. Uniform Width. Uniform width for the traveled portion of the road will not be maintained.
- 11. <u>Inspections</u>. Regular inspections will not be conducted.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUDUBON COUNTY that this County does hereby establish these roads described as an Area Service "C" roads, with restricted access and minimal levels of maintenance.

Road Description #1: A 66 Ft Road commencing at a point approximately 1224 feet East of the Northwest Corner of Government Lot 16 of Section 1, T-78 North, R-35 West of the 5th Principal Meridian and running southeasterly thru lot 16 and thence Southeasterly thru Section 6, T-78 North, R-34 West across Government Lots 13, 20, 19 and the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter thence Southerly along the East side of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 6, T-78 North, R-34 West of the 5th Principal
