WHEREAS, by adopting a construction evaluation resolution the board of supervisors agrees to evaluate every construction permit application for a proposed confinement feeding operation structure received by the board of supervisors between February 1, 2009 and January 31, 2010 and submit an adopted recommendation regarding that application to the DNR; and

WHEREAS, the board of supervisors must conduct an evaluation of every construction permit application using the master matrix created in lowa Code section 459.305, but the board's recommendation to the DNR may be based on the final score on the master matrix or may be based on reasons other than the final score on the master matrix;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUDUBON COUNTY that the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts this construction evaluation resolution pursuant to Iowa Code section 459.304(3).

WHEREAS, Effective immediately, employees will have the option to continue the health insurance coverage for children who no longer qualify for the "dependent" coverage offered under the family plan. Employees will be allowed to continue coverage for "Non-dependent' children on the County's health insurance policy by purchasing a single plan for each non-dependent child. The cost of the single premium, which is set by our health insurance provider, will be due to the Audubon County Treasurer by the 5th day of the month following this election of coverage, or the coverage will be cancelled.

WHEREAS, If a child reaches the "Non-dependent" status and the employee chooses not to continue coverage, the child will be removed from the policy and will not be allowed to be added back on at a later date, except in instances that qualify for COBRA coverage.

RESOLUTION 2009-12

GROUNDWATER HAZARD REPORTING SYSTEM RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Audubon County (County) and the Iowa County Recorders Association have created a county land record information systems in order to provide public access to real estate documents; and

WHEREAS, all Iowa counties are required to process Groundwater Hazard Statements as provided in Iowa Code section 558.69; and

WHEREAS, Iowa Code section 558.69 requires the submission of the Groundwater Hazard Statements to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (Department); and

WHEREAS, the Department has adopted lowa Administrative Code chapter 561 IAC 9, which allows the electronic submission of the Groundwater Hazard Statements; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Department desire to utilize the county land record information system as a means to provide for more efficient and timely filing of the Groundwater Hazard Statements;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County acknowledges that the County is responsible for the processing and filing of Groundwater Hazard Statements as provided in Section 558.69 of the lowa Code and the chapter 561 IAC 9 of the lowa Administrative Code. The County requests that in lieu of forwarding a printed version of any affirmative Groundwater Hazard Statement to the Department of Natural Resources, a facsimile or image of the printed version of the Groundwater Hazard Statement shall be stored the local county land record indexing and imaging system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County agrees to the following terms and conditions.

- a. A facsimile of image of a printed version of all forms required to be submitted to the Department pursuant to 561 IAC 9 shall be stored within the local county land record indexing and imaging system.
- b. The facsimile or image of the form shall be permanently stored in the local county land record indexing and imaging system.
- c. The image shall be legible and shall comply with the document formatting and imaging standards adopted by the Association.
- d. The county and county recorder shall be members of the Electronic Services System.
- e. The county and county recorder shall maintain compliance with the operating policies, procedures and standards adopted by Electronic Services System including but not limited to policies concerning the timely uploading of information to the statewide county land record information system, aka lowa Land Records.
- f. The county recorder shall index the associated document information and the parties (grantors and grantees) for each Groundwater Hazard Statement. The county recorder is not required to index property or legal description information for Groundwater Hazard Statements.
- g. The county and county recorder shall provide 180 days notice prior to reverting to the practice of forwarding a printed version of any affirmative Groundwater Hazard Statement to the Department.

An affirmative response on a Groundwater Hazard Statement means that the Groundwater Hazard Statement indicates a well, underground storage tank, disposal site, or hazardous waste site exists on the property. Pursuant to lowa administrative rule 561 IAC 9.2(3), Groundwater Hazard Statements on which a private burial site is the sole matter disclosed and which do not reveal the existence of a well, disposal site, underground storage tank, or hazardous waste on the property shall not be submitted to the Department.

RESOLUTION 2009-13 HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE

FOR NON-DEPENDENT CHILDREN AS DEFIED IN THE IOWA YOUNG ADULT CHILD CONTINUATION COVERAGE LEGISLATION (HF 2539)

WHEREAS, House File 2539, which passed in 2008, requires Audubon County to allow employees' children, who no longer qualify as "dependents", to remain on the County's health insurance policy. Coverage for the child will continue until the annual renewal date of the coverage on or after the date the child reaches age 25 or marries, whichever occurs sooner.

WHEREAS, Effective immediately, employees will have the option to continue the health insurance coverage for children who no longer qualify for the "dependent" coverage offered under the family plan. Employees will be allowed to continue coverage for "Non-dependent' children on the County's health insurance policy by remaining on the employee's family health insurance plan. A fair market value will be determined and this amount will be included as taxable income with the employee's wages.

WHEREAS, Wellmark of lowa has determined the average number of dependents on a family plan as 2.5, this factor will be used in determining the fair market value of the premium contributed to each dependent.

WHEREAS, If a child reaches the "Non-dependent" status and the employee chooses not to continue coverage, the child will be removed from the policy and will not be allowed to be added back on at a later date, except in instances that qualify for COBRA coverage.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Resolution supersedes Resolution 2009-09 by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, and is retroactive to January 1, 2009.

Motion-Nelson Second-Nelsen to approve the agenda with the addition to discuss the Kjergaard bridge project and Immanuel Lutheran Church restrooms. Vote-all in favor. The Safety meeting was then held. Jeanne Schwab discussed new window door installed at the Public Health Office. Anil presented new DOT approved t-shirts that the secondary road employees will be wearing for the summer. Other discussion included signing up with Wellmark's Whole Health Dimensions Program and Wellness BBQ date.

Anil Sharma, Engineer, gave the secondary road update. Motion-Nelsen Second-Nelson to approve/sign NCRS Assurance Form for Greeley #10 Bridge Stream Bank Stabilization Project DSR-IA-8322-05. Vote-all in favor. Anil presented Puck Enterprise plans and discussed equipment repair monies and budget line items. A request regarding the Kjergaard bridge was presented and the Board instructed Anil to talk to the County Attorney regarding a notification to this request. Larry Sorensen, Secondary Roads, joined the meeting to discuss a couple requests from Glenn Nelson and Gene Leslie regarding a road closing waterway status.

Sheriff Todd Johnson, Bruce Haag, Conservation Director, and Ron Mullenger, representing the Conservation Board, were present to discuss a funding project under the COPS Hiring Recovery Program for extra law enforcement. This program receives these funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. This grant provides funding to create jobs in crime prevention. The grant covers 100% of the costs for hiring a new deputy sheriff for three years, and the fourth year the county pays all costs. Johnson stated the savings for the three years would amount to approximately \$196,000. Haag commented on the increase of revenues and activity he has experienced at Littlefield Park. conservation board has put in budget money for the hiring of a fulltime park ranger. The new deputy sheriff's time would be ¼ conservation ¾ sheriff time sharing from mid-May to mid-September and help with Bruce would like to take a portion of the camping revenues to help pay for the grant enforcement. Johnson added a vehicle cost, but he does have six vehicles to use. Johnson thought he could get by this upcoming year, but would have a new vehicle in the budget for FY11. The grant will not pay for any vehicle usage. Johnson figures it would only cost the county \$57,000. Conservation will pay for \$10,000 to help cover the 4th year and \$4,000 for possible training. The sheriff's budget will be absorbing vehicle and fuel costs. Haag feels there will be an increase in camping if campers feel the safety of having law enforcement present more at the campground. Nelson asked Haag how this would affect his budget. Haag stated that he would be cutting back on certain line items and feels the camping revenues will also be increasing like it has every year. Johnson stated his full-time deputy status has not increased in 20 years. Nelsen commented that he has increased his staff in other areas, one being for the reason to let his deputies spend more time fighting crime. Johnson was not aware of the award date of the grant.

Nelsen asked Haag about this extra person he was hiring fulltime in July. Haag feels the new deputy sheriff is a better option than training a park maintenance person to be a park ranger. They are looking at more preventative measures for the campground. Johnson has no details on the money he will be spending and timeline. Venteicher was concerned of the after fact of the grant money and the county being stuck with another full-time deputy. Haag commented that he did not feel conservation would want to spend money on the deputy after the grant money is exhausted. Johnson presented a Resolution of hire, contingent to being awarded the COPS grant. Johnson figured in raises whether they would get them or not. Nelson asked Ron Mullenger his thoughts on the situation. Ron stated that there is \$4000 that they are saving for this park ranger training but they would rather have the grant money deputy. Haag does not have enough money to hire a 2080 hour park ranger. Johnson said the new deputy would provide more help for courthouse security, more on road patrol time and to cover other deputy's vacation time. Nelsen asked why the as needed officers could not be covering these things. Mullenger asked who will be monitoring the grant monies. This is covered by the sheriff's office. Due to the fact that the grant's deadline is April 1, 2009, the Board will need to discuss and let Johnson know back today.

Johnson updated the Board on the removal of a tub/shower basin that he would like removed and replaced with a basin. He has checked with the historical society and this is only a construction change to the courthouse and will not affect historic value. Venteicher mentioned that could commissary funds be used. This is more the sheriff's side of it and not the jail side of it. He has enough money in his budget for this. Bruce Nelson will work with Johnson on the request of bathroom renovation.

WHEREAS, Audubon County desires to classify certain roads on the area service system in the County to provide for a minimal level of maintenance and access by means of a gate or barrier; and WHEREAS, the County, after consultation with the County Engineer, has the authority to specify certain roads within the County as Area Service "C" roads pursuant to lowa Code Section 309.57; and WHEREAS, the County has received a petition, attached to this resolution, signed by all landowners adjoining the road, requesting that the following roads be classified as Area Service "C" roads; and WHEREAS, the only persons who will have access rights to the roads shall be:

(1) the owner, lessee, or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,

- (2) The agent or employee of the owner, lessee or person in lawful possession of any adjoining land,
- (3) any peace officer,

(4) any magistrate,

- any public employee whose duty it is to supervise the use or perform maintenance of the road,
- (6) any agent or employee of any utility located upon the road.

WHEREAS, the minimal level of maintenance will be as follows:

- 1. <u>Blading</u>. Blading or dragging will not be performed on a regular basis.
- 2. Snow and Ice Removal. Snow and ice will not be removed, nor will the road surface be sanded or salted on a regular basis.
- 3. <u>Signing</u>. Except for load limit posting for bridges, signing shall not be continued or provided. <u>ALL AREA SERVICE LEVEL C ROADS SHALL BE IDENTIFIED WITH A SIGN AT ALL POINTS OF ACCESS TO WARN THE PUBLIC OF THE LOWER LEVEL OF MAINTENANCE</u>.
- 4. <u>Weeds, Brush and Trees.</u> Mowing or spraying weeds, cutting brush and tree removal will not be performed on a regular basis. Adequate sight distances will not be maintained.
- 5. <u>Structures</u>. Bridges and culverts may not be maintained to carry legal loads. Upon failure or loss, the replacement structure will be appropriate for the traffic thereon.
- 6. <u>Road Surfacing.</u> There will be no surfacing materials applied to Area Service System C Roads on a regular basis.
- 7. <u>Shoulders</u>. Shoulders will not be maintained on a regular basis.
- 8. Crown. A crown will not be maintained on a regular basis.
- 9. Repairs. There will be no road repair on a regular basis.
- 10. Uniform Width. Uniform width for the traveled portion of the road will not be maintained.

11. Inspections. Regular inspections will not be conducted.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF AUDUBON COUNTY that this County does hereby establish these roads described as an Area Service "C" roads, with restricted access and minimal levels of maintenance.

Road Description #1: A 66 Ft Road beginning at the centerline of Section 26, T-78 North, R-36 West of the 5th Principal Meridian thence north approximately 900 feet.

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The road is further described as being known as Heron Ave. located in Section 26 of Oakfield Township. Also described in county road records as a portion of County Road #36, Road Book "P" page 10, established July 15, 1872.

Road Description #2: A 40 Ft Road beginning at the NE Corner of the SE ¼ of Section 26, T-78-North, R-36 West of the 5th Principal Meridian thence South approximately 1840 feet.

The road is further described as being known as Heron Place located in Section 26 of Oakfield Township. Also described in county road records as a portion of County Road #437, Road Book "D " page 56, established April 3, 1894.
