SUPERVISOR'S MINUTE BOOK 2025

August 12th, 2025

The meeting of the Board of Supervisors was called to order at 9:05 am by Chairman Heath Hansen. Present at the meeting were Heath Hansen, Don Mosinski, Kent Grabill, Chassity Musfeldt, Miranda Bills, Deb Campbell, Chris Swensen, Todd Johnson, Brandon Hardy, John Hansen, Tyler Thygesen, and Mitch Rydl.

Motion- Grabill Second- Mosinski to approve the agenda. Vote-all in favor. The sales tax and credit card policies were reviewed. Motion- Mosinski Second- Grabill to approve the updates to the policies. Vote-all in favor. Treasurer Campbell met with the Supervisors to discuss four parcels that have been acquired by the City of Exira and would like approval for tax abatements. Motion- Mosinski Second-Grabill to approve the tax abatements on the following parcels all owned by the City of Exira: 05-11-04-016-130, 05-11-03-012-210, 05-11-04-016-066, and 05-11-04-016-067. Vote-all in favor. Motion- Grabill Second- Mosinski to approve the revised policies 15 (Claims Approval) and 16 (Petty Cash). Vote-all in favor.

The August Department Head meeting was held at 9:30 am. Chairman Hansen discussed the recent policy revisions and said the Supervisors may be reaching out to different departments if the policy pertains to them. State Auditors will be working onsite this week for the FY25 Audit. There will be a safety meeting at 2:00 pm today in the Board room. Recorder Bills said the County was close to 100% participation for the Wellness exams. The Public Hearing for the Temporary Moratorium of battery/energy storage within Audubon County was opened at 10:20 am.

Engineer Rydl gave recent Secondary Roads construction and maintenance updates. A recent topic has been the dead trees that could or have potentially fallen into the right-of-way but were located on privately owned land. The question would be whether the landowner or the County was responsible for this. The Iowa Code sections were referenced. Rydl said on September 25th, there will be a John Deere factory tour if anyone is interested in going. This is where the three new motor graders are being assembled. Motion- Mosinski Second-Grabill to approve the Casey Mutual Telephone Company utility permit located along 270th St, T79N, R34W in Greeley Township. Vote-all in favor. Motion- Grabill Second- Mosinski to approve the water line utility permit application for Tony Smith located at 2764 Falcon Ave, Sections 35 & 36 in T79N, R36W in Sharon Township. Vote-all in favor. The plans were presented and reviewed for the upcoming Mockingbird HMA paving project (Exira). Motion- Grabill Second- Mosinski to approve the plans/bid documents for the Mockingbird HMA paving project. Vote-all in favor. The Brayton project is now completed. Rydl would like to have a potential meeting in September with the City of Brayton to discuss the payment to the County. Crews have been busy with bridge maintenance and ditch cleaning.

Resolution 2025-46

A resolution authorizing a temporary moratorium on utility-scale Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS), in Audubon County, Iowa

WHEREAS, Iowa Code Section 331.302 requires a county to compile ordinances every 5 years, and the County currently does not have a specific ordinance pertaining to utility-scale Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS); and WHEREAS, the County has an interest in protecting resident's life, health, and safety as well as safeguarding the County's infrastructure, natural resources and property rights through adequate zoning standards;

WHEREAS, the Audubon Board of Supervisors and the Audubon Planning & Zoning Commission require time to gather information and coordinate with agencies for the purpose of reviewing, updating or creating ordinances, policies, and procedures relative to utility-scale Battery Energy Storage Systems development;

WHEREAS, a public hearing on and reading of a resolution imposing a temporary moratorium on utility-scale battery energy storage systems was held at 10:00 a.m., on August 12, 2025, in the Audubon County Board of Supervisors Meeting Room;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; by the Board of Supervisors of Audubon County, Iowa, that Audubon County now imposes a temporary moratorium, effective immediately and until the January 1, 2026; or until passage of an Utility-Scale Battery Energy Storage Systems Development ordinance, on accepting or processing any applications for the construction of utility-scale Battery Energy Storage Systems.
