

March 17<sup>th</sup>, 2026

The meeting of the Board of Supervisors was called to order at 9:01 am by Chairman Kent Grabill. Present at the meeting were Kent Grabill, Don Mosinski, Chassity Musfeldt, Clark Borkowski, Paul Nielsen, Randy Dreher, Mitch Rydl, John Hansen, and Debbie Campbell. Heath Hansen-Absent.

Motion- Mosinski Second- Grabill to approve the agenda. Vote-all in favor. Chairman Grabill discussed the Globe Life Insurance presentation from last week. Grabill will call Adams back and let him know that he can utilize a room to speak with employees if they choose to meet with him, but this would not be part of the County's benefits, it would be a personal decision. Motion- Mosinski Second- Grabill to accept/file the Sheriff's asset addition. Vote-all in favor. Supervisor's meeting updates included an upcoming East/West Nishnabotna meeting Thursday that Grabill will be attending. Grabill attended ISAC meetings in Des Moines last week. A major topic discussed was AI, and being careful with what is entered into search engines. Once information is entered, it is copied/stays and putting personal/confidential information into outside sources can be dangerous. ISAC has been training with Tyler/Incode to start taking calls for support help. House files, discrimination, and regulations with water were other popular topics. Supervisor Mosinski attended the ACED meeting last Friday morning. He will have Region XII meetings this week. Later today he will attend the Health Board meeting.

Motion- Mosinski Second- Grabill to approve the DNR Annual MMP Updates/Changes for Handlos-Irlmeier #68002 and Muhr (Handlos) #65707. Vote-all in favor. Motion- Mosinski Second- Grabill to accept/file the Clerk of Court's fees collected for February 2026. Vote-all in favor. Public Comment was opened at 9:17 am. Grabill gave an update on the Courthouse sewer issues. Sontaag Plumbing was up and ran some cameras to locate the issues. It was suggested to put a couple of additional clean outs on. Sontaag will provide a quote to Custodian Hansen for this service. Motion- Mosinski Second- Grabill to approve the meeting minutes of 3-10-26. Vote-all in favor. Motion- Mosinski Second- Grabill to approve claims as submitted by various departments to be paid in the amount of \$62,015.20 and published in a separate publication at the end of the month. Vote-all in favor. The discussion of the payment plan from the City of Brayton Road project was tabled as Brayton did not reach out to be on the agenda yet. Discussion will be on for next week's meeting.

Randy Dreher inquired about ACED and what the objective/goals are. Mosinski explained that the main goal is economic development for the County. This includes everything from revitalization, new housing, new business support, clean-up of existing properties, and promoting growth for the local economy. Tourism is also a large part of ACED. Mosinski encourages the public to reach out to the board members if they ever have questions. ACED also offers grants to the local communities. Mosinski explained that the money ACED has received from the Valley Business Park sale has been used for local economic development, and the yearly allocation from the County is utilized for administrative costs.

Engineer Rydl and Custodian John Hansen met with Supervisors to discuss a transfer of service for Hansen to work for Secondary Roads and leave his position as Custodian of the Courthouse. Rydl said Hansen applied, was interviewed, and offered the job. Supervisors inquired about the potential of a situation where Hansen's knowledge of the Courthouse HVAC/broiler would be needed, and if he would be allowed to help out. Supervisors would like Hansen to prepare a checklist/book of dates/information of Courthouse maintenance, schedules, and other information that is crucial to the job. Motion- Mosinski Second- Grabill to accept/file the retirement/resignation letter of Louis Wanninger from Secondary Roads after 35 years of service to the County. Vote-all in favor. Rydl discussed the cost sharing policy between landowners and the County for tile crossing under County Roads. The policy has not been updated for several years. The budgeting for a specific dollar amount instead of the cost share policy was discussed. Rydl said these scenarios generally do not come up more than once or twice a year, except back in the 90's there were several. Crews will be hauling rock to roads, weather pending, starting in April. Rydl will be meeting with landowners along the East Side Drive project in Exira this week. On Thursday, Secondary Roads will be hosting a flagger training class for Audubon and surrounding counties. Rydl said they will still have one open position at Secondary Roads. They currently have 6 work orders with the grinder they would like to get wrapped up before the rock hauling starts.

Treasurer Campbell gave an update on the current interest rates received from the bank for a CD instead

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of a savings account for the remainder of the Valley Business Park Sales. The rates were about the same as what the current earnings are in the account they're currently in. Meeting adjourned at 11:12 am.
